Mr. Brown thanked the BOE for taking time to honor the Park Ridge teams. The first presentation was made to Cole Hughes who was named Athlete of the Week. Cole rushed for 140+ yards and two rushing and two passing touchdowns in one game. He led the OWLS to victory over Midland Park. Mr. Brown presented him with an award from the district. The next presentation was to the Boys Soccer team. The team finished the year with a 10-5-2 record and were NJIC Patriot Division Champs. Of their many highlights, they defeated Emerson 2-0 and clinched the league title. Several players were recognized for their League and County honors. Each player was called up to receive a championship sweatshirt. Next, Mr. Brown recognized the coaching staff. Mr. Brown also mentioned that district was given a Sportsmanship award by the league.

Mr. Lederman presented an award to Christina Vitale for being a National Merit Scholar. He stated that 1.5 million students took the SAT. The top 5% received commendations. Mr. Lederman congratulated Christina for her accomplishment.

Ms. Park recognized two students for their achievement on being named to the Bergen County Choir. The program has been active since 1964. Of the 248 auditions only 173 were accepted. Olivia and Justin were selected. This is Olivia's 1st year in the program and Justin's 2nd. Justin came in the top 10. Both students showed a lot of commitment coming in every day after school. They were presented with certificates representing their high achievement.

Dr. Gamper thanked Mr. Brown, Troy, Ms. Park and the coaches for their hard work. He commented on the unity that the Soccer team showed as the entire team showed up tonight.

Dr. Gamper reported that there were no new HIB cases.

He reported on a meeting with Chief Madden to discuss the school security officers. They spoke about using class 3 officers. Dr. Gamper recommended moving forward in the new year with one officer in each building. The Police department would be responsible for hiring and the Board would have input on the candidates. The next steps are to review a draft proposal of the agreement between the town and the school.

Dr. Gamper commented on the East Brook cell service issue. He reported that Mr. Lepore was working with a company to install repeaters inside the building that would improve cell service. He also commented that every classroom has a land line phone and that all Police radios do work inside of East Brook.

Dr. Gamper reported that he attended the High School instrumental concerts and will be attending the upcoming one at East Brook. He finished by thanking Ms. Comeau for her service as a Board member.

Finance – Reported that they met on 12/12. They discussed the 23-24 budget and the rising costs in Health care

WHEREAS, the Alliance For Competitive Energy Services (hereinafter referred to as "ACES"), an alliance composed of the New Jersey School Boards Association (hereinafter referred to as "NJSBA"), the New Jersey Association of School Administrators, and the New Jersey Association of School Business Officials, will from time to time during the Effective Period as defined below solicit bids from natural gas suppliers for retail natural gas supply services including interstate transportation to the local natural gas distribution utility company (Natural Gas Supply Services) through an energy aggregation program in which NJSBA will act as Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS in accordance with the "Public School Contracts Law", N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 et seq., and the Electric Discount and Energy Competition Act, N.J.S.A. 48:3-49 et seq. ("EDECA") and the regulations promulgated thereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Park Ridge Board of Education is a Participating member of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System and is eligible thereby to obtain natural gas services for its own use through one or more contracts to be awarded to natural gas suppliers following said bids for natural gas services pursuant to the aggregation program; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will from time to time during the Effective Period (from date of adoption through May, 2028, hereinafter referred to as "Effective Period") issue one or more Requests for Bids for natural gas services on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System pursuant to the Public School Contracts Law and EDECA; and

WHEREAS, due to significant volatility and the potential for price increases in the wholesale natural gas market, Participating Members will preauthorize the Lead Agency to award contracts for Natural Gas Supply Service in each service territory to one or more natural gas suppliers that submits bids which are reasonably forecasted to provide estimated savings to the Participating Member based upon its previous natural gas usage and utility provided Basic Gas Supply Service rates; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will only award contracts for said Natural Gas Supply Services to natural gas suppliers that submit bids with pricing reasonably estimated to be lower than the utility-provided basic gas supply service; and

WHEREAS, the District agrees to purchase all Natural Gas Supply Services for its own use during the Effective Period through any natural gas supplier(s) awarded a contract, it being understood that the term of any one contract shall be subject to the provisions of Public School Contracts Law; and

WHEREAS, the Lead Agency will notify the Department of Community Affairs' Division of Local Government Services by mail prior to the issuance a Request for Bids for natural gas supply services, with the understanding that if the Division of Local Government Services does not respond within 10 business days, it will be deemed to have approved the issuance of the Request for Bids or the Request for Rebids.

NOW, therefore, be it RESOLVED that the District binds itself to the ACES Cooperative Pricing System ##E8801-ACESCPS to purchase all natural gas supply services needed for its own use during the Effective Period from the natural gas supplier or suppliers awarded a contract for natural Gas supply services by the Lead Agency; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Lead Agency of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System is hereby authorized to execute a master performance agreement that obligates the district to purchase natural gas at the terms and conditions stated therein with a third-party supplier or suppliers who have been awarded the contract or contracts by the Lead Agency on behalf of the participating members of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System #E8801-ACESCPS (or any CPS number to be assigned in the future), and provided further that all such contracts shall be at prices reasonably forecast and estimated by the Lead Agency to provide savings to the districts relative to the price charged for basic gas supply service by the natural gas public utility that would otherwise provide such service; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that ACES is authorized to continue to bid to obtain natural gas services at any time during the Effective Period on behalf of the ACES Cooperative Pricing System including, for example, a rebid if energy market conditions do not initially lead to a successful bid, on additional dates to be determined by the Lead Agency; and

FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. The authorization provided to the NJSBA pursuant to the Local Public Contracts Laws (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-11(5)), and the Local Public and Public School Contracts Laws Administrative Code (N.J.A.C. 5:34-7.1 et seq.) shall be valid until May, 2028 (the Effective Period) at which time the Cooperative Pricing System will be subject to renewal. Any rescission of this resolution shall not affect any Agreements entered into prior to such rescission or expiration. **"F13"**
