PATHWAY TO THE SEAL OF BILITERACY AWARD

The State Seal of Biliteracy recognizes students who have studied and attained proficiency in two or more languages by high school. At Oak Grove School District, we created a pathway for students to be recognized for their successful academic achievement in English and Spanish. Students who participate in our Dual Language programs will have the opportunity to obtain the Pathway to the Seal of Biliteracy Award.

The intent of this award is to encourage students to continue their journey towards biliteracy as they progress through middle school. Students who meet this local criterion will be granted the Pathway to the Seal of Biliteracy Award at the end of sixth and eighth grade



THE PROGRAM

Dual Language Immersion is a unique educational model where children learn to think, read, write and communicate naturally in two languages: English and Spanish. Native Spanish speaking students study both languages beginning in Kindergarten through 6th grade, to be biliterate in both languages.
