

Board Policy S-10: Student Fees and Fee Waivers

THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education ensures that a free education is provided to all district students in grades K-6. For students in grades 7-12, the board recognizes the need for student fees to fund certain school programs, activities, and courses, but is committed to minimizing the financial burden of student fees on families. Every effort shall be made to keep student fees to a minimum. When a school fee is charged, schools only recover actual costs and cannot realize any profit. Each year, the public has at least two opportunities to comment on the proposed fee schedule before its approval and adoption by the board. The district will adopt and implement fees, fee waivers, and refund procedures in accordance with state law and this policy.

The purpose of this policy is to ensure compliance with state law in the adoption and collection of student fees, to provide annual notice to students and their parents of the board-approved fee schedule and fee waiver procedures, and to prohibit practices that would exclude students who are unable to pay from participating in school-sponsored activities or create a financial burden which has a detrimental impact on a student’s participation.

The district has set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying [administrative procedures](#).
