8.3. Principal Reports

Nina Craig, Bellevue Principal, shared:

Good evening,

We hope you're all doing well as we prepare to enter this holiday season.

As you know, this is parent teacher conference week, so our campuses are buzzing with chatter as families are coming and going and meeting with their child's teacher.

This past month our district has provided numerous professional development opportunities for our certificated staff.

2nd-3rd grade teachers participated in 3 days of GLAD training. Each morning began with over 20 of our teachers packed into the back of a 3rd grade classroom while a trainer taught and modeled strategies with our students. Another trainer would highlight and point things out to teachers while they observed. Teachers then had the afternoon to plan and prepare next steps for implementation in their classrooms with their team.

Multiple trainings were held on the Nov 1 PD day. Our PE teachers received SPARKS training (physical education lessons) while our other certificated staff attended positive behavior interventions and support, PBIS, training. The training emphasized the importance of building strong classroom communities and relationships with our students to support positive behaviors on campus.

Teachers also participated in professional development on the Next Generation Science Standards. We engaged in hands-on explorative activities based on science standards as examples of what teachers can do with their students.

Just last week, we participated in a Trauma Informed training brought to us by On the Margins. This was one of the PDs in our trauma series that Tracy had mentioned to you previously. We explored Cultural Humility & Implicit Bias.

All district teachers had the opportunity to join an optional Webinar offered by CA Ed Partners which are the folks leading our work in building Math Coherence. The focus was "Leveraging Student Thinking to Support Math Conversations" which ties in directly with our Number Talks training that was held earlier in October.

In addition, our 5th Grade teachers are now working with Krista McAtee from SCOE. Last week, she came to all of our sites to model a Number Talks lesson with our students. This is a method of teaching that helps develop critical thinking and conversation in the classroom. Teachers observed and then debriefed with Krista to deepen their understanding of how to implement these simple yet powerful techniques.

We have held Goal Setting Meetings with Teachers for the year. We've been providing opportunities for teachers to observe one another as well. It feels like a culture of learning is being nurtured....the amount of PD offered this past month is remarkable.

We continue to provide a range of opportunities to encourage parent involvement on our campuses.

ELAC committees have discussed attendance, EL Programs and the Reclassification process with their members and provided resources to families in preparation for the Parent–Teacher conferences this week.

Our Site Councils either already have or are preparing to analyze first trimester student achievement data in order to make decisions about the next steps for our site plans.

Finally, Parent Clubs are busy planning December events to celebrate the season! At Kawana Springs, they will celebrate with a Winter Tree Lighting and marimba performance... At Meadow View Pancakes with Santa and a Winter Concert... At Taylor Mountain a Posole and Loteria night with a marimba performance and at Bellevue we are hosting our Winter Wonderland event and will have a Winter Concert as well.

Superintendent Kellison shared:

Gratitude can decrease depression, anxiety, difficulties with chronic pain and risk of disease." As we enter into our Thanksgiving Break, I feel it important to express my gratitude to those in the Bellevue Union School District community who consistently provide support and who contribute to our ongoing success as a learning community.

- <u>BUSD Board of Trustees:</u> The elected officials who serve on the Board do so as stewards
 of their community. They volunteer their time to ensure that the District is the best it can
 be and help ensure that the focus is always on students. We are appreciative of their
 dedication to BUSD and to creating a strong governance team focused on quality policies
 and practices.
- BUSD Staff and Faculty: Nearly 250 individuals work for BUSD providing a range of services from teaching to cleaning to cooking to general care and support of students. This group works together to provide a high quality education to the more than 1600 students that Bellevue serves. What an incredible group of people that I am grateful to work alongside.
- <u>BUSD Parents:</u> Our BUSD parents are wonderful. They provide support to each of their respective schools through volunteering as chaperones on field trips, helpers in classrooms and through their work on the various parent organizations that fundraise and give back to our schools. We value the relationships that we have with our parent community and thank them for entrusting their child's education to BUSD.

I am filled with gratitude and pride for those who call the Bellevue Union School District home.

State of the District

- Communication: The District has recently signed a contract to partner with ParentSquare as their provider for District communications. Over the next few months we will be migrating our information to the new ParentSquare system and will be using it to send out news and updates. Additionally, this system will allow families the ability to communicate directly with their child's teacher through the ParentSquare app. The app features real time translation allowing for families and teachers to communicate more effectively.
- Comprehensive School Safety Plan: The District will be seeking individuals who wish to be part of our District Safety Committee. The role of the committee is to provide input and guidance in the revision of the annual safety plan. If this is something that may be of interest to you, keep an eye out for a message on how to sign up to be part of this committee.
- Facilities and Planning for Future Projects: In 2020 the voters in the Bellevue Union School District graciously approved Measure C, a facilities bond that has yielded \$28M to address several areas of the District's buildings and grounds. The focal project of the bond has been the Kawana Springs Multi-Purpose Room and administrative offices. With that project nearing completion, the focus has shifted to the playgrounds and outdoor play areas. Over the next several months, the District will be moving forward with replacing outdated playground equipment in the Kindergarten yards at all four of our school sites. Additionally, the District will be looking to improve the quality of our fields by resurfacing them and adding exterior running track spaces. It is our hope that these projects will provide our students with additional opportunities to engage in physical activity in an effort to improve their overall health.

In closing, I extend to you and your family a Thanksgiving week filled with family and festivities. I hope that you are able to take time to express your gratitude to those important people in your

life.
