B. Retiree Recognition

Dr. Gamper spoke about the awards for the two sports team and introduced Chris Brown, the Athletic Director. Mr. Brown spoke about the accomplishments of the Girls Track and Field team. They beat their rivals Emerson and Cresskill and went on to become NJIC Patriot champions. The team set two school records in the 400 and 600 and had several athletes receive individual recognitions. Mr. Brown then called up each member of the team to receive a championship sweatshirt. The coaches were also called up and given certificates of accomplishment.

Mr. Brown then spoke about the Girls Lacrosse team. They finished the season with a 5-1 record and had several victories that occurred with less than a minute to play on their way to a NJIGLL Championship. He characterized the players as cool under pressure. Won with less than a minute to go. He commented that this was their 2nd title in 4 years. Mr. Brown then called up each member of the team to receive a championship sweatshirt. The coaches were also called up and given certificates of accomplishment.

Mr. Brown thanked the Board of Education for having this recognition of the teams.

Dr. Gamper then spoke about three staff members who were retiring. Overall, they represented 70 years of experience. First was Anne Chambers. He praised her for developing great relationships with students as an inclusion teacher and commented that she was well liked. He then called Ms. Chambers up and presented her with a certificate of appreciation from the Board.

Next, Dr. Gamper spoke about Vita Rotella. Ms. Rotella served for 23 years as the High School nurse. She was a loyal member of the faculty and always placed student and staff health and safety first. He called Ms. Rotella up and presented her with a certificate.

Dr. Gamper then spoke about Debbie Claire. Ms. Claire worked as an educator for 28 years. She started as classroom teacher, moved to Media specialist and is now a STEAM instructor. She has a wonderful personality and is easy to work with. Dr. Gamper wished her all the best in her retirement. He then called Ms. Claire up and presented her with a certificate of appreciation from the Board.

WHEREAS, Jane has served on the Board of Education as the Student Representative from September 2018 through June 2019 and,


WHEREAS, Jane has distinguished herself both in the quality of the reports she has given and the dedication she has showed by her involvement and,

Dr. Gamper reported that he attended the Renaissance dinner at Seasons and the Valedictorian breakfast with Samantha Green. He commented that the number of Senior awards this year was impressive. On June 14th, he attended the OWL house breakfast which was held at the Iron Horse in Westwood. He commented that it was a spectacular event.
