- 4. Maintain Documentation



WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOLS THAT RECEIVE TITLE I FUNDS?

- 5. Detail how Title I funds will be used in the campus improvement plan
- 6. Spend money in ways that meet the purpose of Title I
- 7. Incorporate instructional strategies based on scientifically-based research
- 8. Supplement, not supplant, other efforts
- 9. Implement parental involvement activities
