

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOLS THAT RECEIVE TITLE I FUNDS?

1. Provide parents with a “right to know” notice
2. Hire highly qualified staff
3. Conduct a Title 1 meeting with parents
4. Maintain Documentation



WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOLS THAT RECEIVE TITLE I FUNDS?

5. Detail how Title I funds will be used in the campus improvement plan
6. Spend money in ways that meet the purpose of Title I
7. Incorporate instructional strategies based on scientifically-based research
8. Supplement, not supplant, other efforts
9. Implement parental involvement activities
