<p>Push a laundry basket down the hallway, or to another room, that has a few books in it, or favorite toys.</p>	<p>Find all your toys that are the color red</p>	<p>Sing song- "First your snow pants, then your boots, coat, then hat, then gloves, and maybe a scarf!" And have your child practice the sequence of dressing for going outside to play.</p>	<p>Make a fort out of some blankets under a table or by furniture. <p>Fill a container with rice with measuring cups and small items to play in</p>	<p>Brainstorm different ways of making a snowman (big snowball on the bottom, snowman taking a nap, snowman sitting down, snowman playing ball) talk about what you need to make that snowman</p>	<p>Make the snowman you brainstormed about</p>	<p>Memorize part of a nursery rhyme together</p>	<p>Make a simple recipe like pancakes and help your child measure ingredients, count how many times you need to stir to mix it all together.</p>
