SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

The Phelps-Clifton Springs CSD is composed of the two villages of Phelps and Clifton Springs as well as several smaller hamlets. The school district has an approximate population of 10,000 and is located 28 miles east of Rochester and 50 miles west of Syracuse. Several internationally known industrial high-tech companies, as well as a state renowned hospital, provide employment to many in the community. The Phelps-Clifton Springs CSD provides diversified business, professional and agri-business services to the Finger Lakes Area. Agri-business opportunities in the area are enhanced by the district's proximity to the Cornell Agricultural Experimental Station.

For the 2023-2024 school-year, Midlakes High School has an enrollment of approximately 475 students in grades 9 – 12.

COURSE AVERAGES, CLASS RANK & CUMULATIVE GPA

Class rank and cumulative GPA are computed based on the final average in all subject areas except Driver's Education and courses taken at alternate locations. For full-year courses, final course averages are determined by averaging the 4 quarter grades (each with a weight of 20% and the mid-term and final exams (each with a weight of 10%). For half-year courses, final course averages are determined by averaging the 2 quarter grades (each with a weight of 40%) and the final exam (with a weight of 20%). Passing for all courses is 65, or higher. All Advanced Placement (AP) and all dual enrollment classes are weighted by 10%. Weighted courses will be marked with an "*" in front of the course name. This weighting is only reflected in cumulative GPA calculations and class rank calculations, not on the final course average itself. Cumulative GPA and class rank are calculated at the end of each semester, through seven semesters.

Please note that in the 2019-2020 school year, 4th quarter grades could not negatively impact a student's overall grade.
