About Our District

 Our students and staff's safety and security are our number one priority. Our continuing goal is to provide our 19,000 students with a healthy learning environment during and after school.



Physical Security

Building Design & Security

- Cameras
- Keyless entry to all buildings controlled by badges
- Limited entrances and access to buildings
- Security vestibules and access controls for visitor management
- Lockdown/lockout emergency alert buttons
- 911 alert system



Building Design & Security

- Inside door locking device
- Peepholes in doors without a window
- Completely fenced elementary schools
- Radios are supplied to all schools
- Busses are equipped with a camera and tracking system



Partnership with PPD

- The Pasco Police Department:
 - Co-created and supported delivery of training of staff who provide visitor management using Security Foyers and Access Controls
 - Has maps, key cards, and keys for all district facilities
 - Provides Active Shooter Training for staff



School Resource Officers

- Employees from the Pasco Police Department who promote lawful behavior and protect the welfare of our middle and high school students and staff.
- Their consistent presence allows them to understand the rhythms of the building while developing strong relationships with students.

Emergency Response Systems

- Incident Command System (ICS)
 - Standardized incident management approach
- Common terminology and functions across jurisdictions
- Tabletop drills with first responders and Franklin County Emergency Management



Emergency Drills

- PSD conducts required emergency drills in our schools once a month while school is in session.
- Students and staff routinely practice four basic functional threat or hazard responses pertaining to:
 - Shelter-in-place
 - Lockdown/Lockout
 - Evacuation
 - Earthquake

Training for Staff

School staff are trained on:

- Visitor management
- Access to control procedures
- Crisis Response Training with the Pasco Police
- Online safety training offered through Vector Solutions
