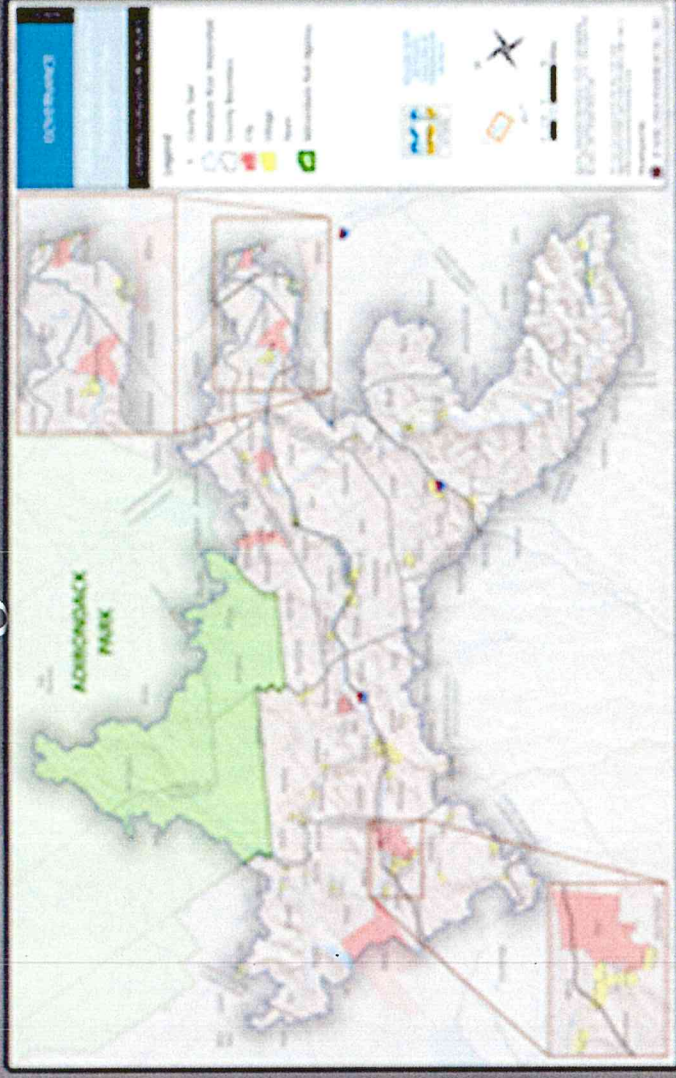

What is a watershed?

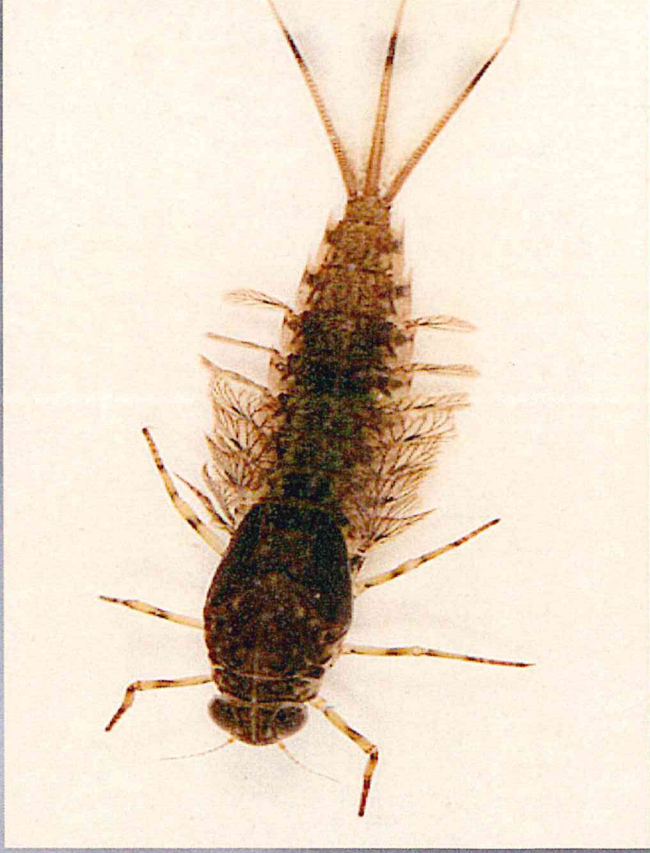
- ▣ Streams that connect to one another that lead to a larger body of water
- ▣ Runoff from rain can collect garbage, oil, animal poop, and fertilizer can go into the water

- ▣ We studied the Mohawk River watershed because the Sauquoit Creek is a part of it and our community



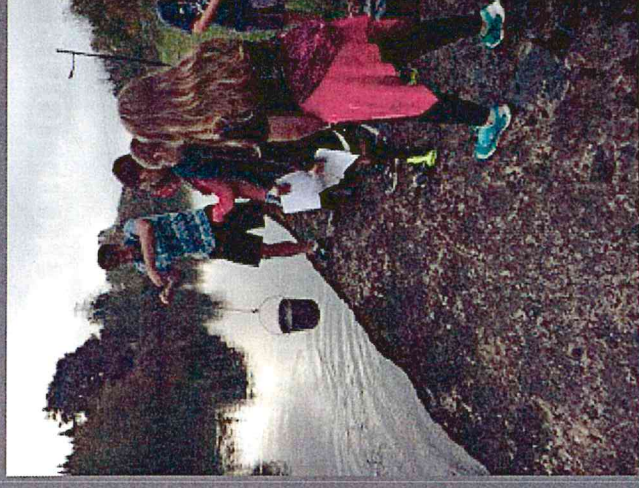
Insect Identification

- ▣ Bugs in the water can tell you if it the water is healthy or unhealthy water
- ▣ Bugs that can tolerate healthy water are mayflies, stoneflies, and dragonflies
- ▣ Bugs that like to live in unhealthy water are blackflies, leeches, and worms
- ▣ We used a dichotomous key to learn how to identify the bugs



Field Trip Number 1

- ▣ We went to 4 different streams to study their health
- ▣ Barge Canal, Mohawk River, Oriskany Creek, and Sauquoit Creek
- ▣ 3 tests: water quality, collected insects, and visual assessment
- ▣ Most fun test: collecting insects



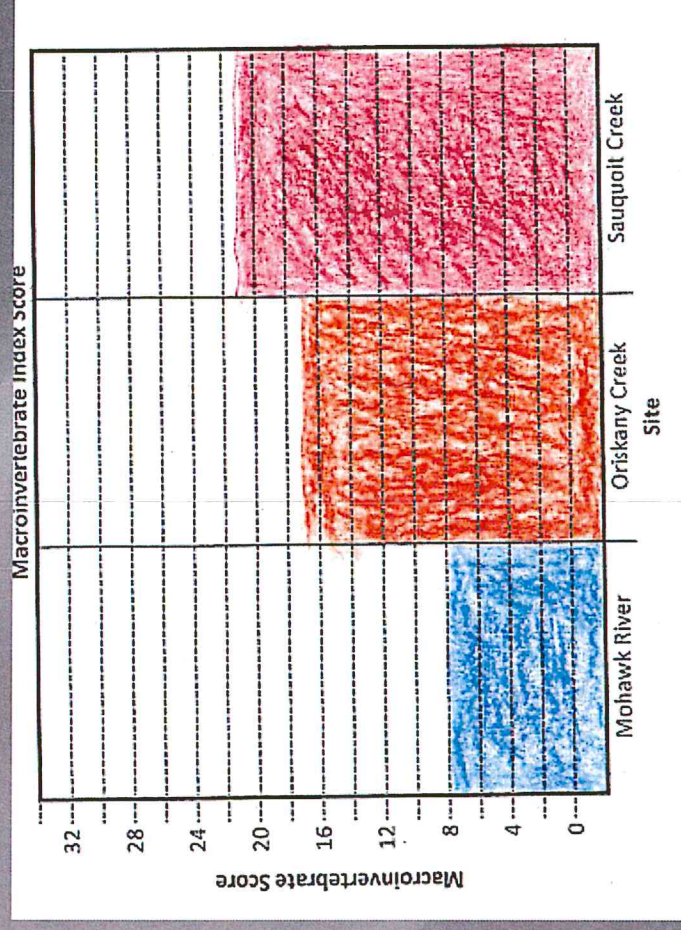
What did we find?

- ▣ We looked through what we collected for insects
- ▣ Looked at them under the dissecting microscope
- ▣ We used the dichotomous keys to identify the insects



Evaluating Our Numbers

- ▣ We made graphs showing the water quality results and macroinvertebrate index score
- ▣ This allowed us to make a conclusion on how healthy the water was



Field Trip Number 2



- ▣ We went to the Sauquoit Creek to help the DEC make the area healthier
- ▣ We planted willow trees, milkweed and joe-pye weed seeds
- ▣ This helps with flooding issues

Putting it all together

Were the creeks healthy or not?

- ❑ Barge Canal - not healthy because the visual assessment was low (straight path, no vegetation), and a high temperature (bad for bugs)
- ❑ Mohawk River - healthy because temperature was lower, good visual assessment (lots of vegetation along banks), but a poor biotic insects (few bugs)
- ❑ Oriskany Creek - healthy because lowest temperature, low turbidity, the highest visual assessment, and a good biotic index
- ❑ Sauquoit Creek - healthy because high dissolved oxygen, low turbidity, a good visual assessment, a good biotic index

Lab Report

- ▣ We summarized our findings in a lab report
- ▣ We wrote a rough draft, and seniors and juniors helped us edit our papers
- ▣ We then submitted our final copy (finally☺)

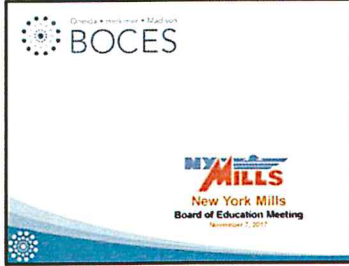

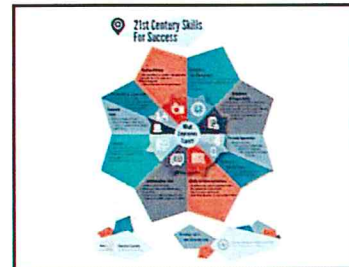

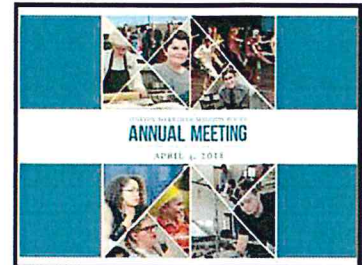

6.1 Homecoming Weekend

Mr. Dodge reported that the kids were enthusiastic for Homecoming Weekend. The 7th graders did a fabulous job. Students donated a chair for their Dr. Seuss theme. The seniors took home the Powder Puff victory.

Mrs. Facci said the elementary students were also involved in Spirit Week. PTSO sponsored an essay contest on “What It Means To Be A Marauder” and the students dressed up every day in different themes similar to the high school.

Mr. Dodge said that over 50 of our students did attend and hear stories by a panel facilitated by Erin Gruwell from the Freedom Writers. It did spark a little bit of interest and maybe we can host something down the road.

7. Superintendent's Report

7.1 New York Mills Budget Process

Dr. Shelmidine said that she would like to take the budget process on the road. It is important for us to have a narrative of frequently asked questions. She said the working on Budget 101 has been a learning curve for her. She has been working with Lisa Stamboly on the nuts and bolts of putting on a school budget. The booklet contains definitions, what a budget cycle looks like, a glossary to explain the whole process.

7.2 Attendance

On November 1st there was an evening of principals and other administrators to look at the whole idea of chronic attendance. We have found in elementary school if students are missing 10% of the days they run the risk of not being able to read on grade level etc. For the BOCES region 20% of the students are chronically absent. New York Mills' average is 15%. As we identify those students, we need to review trends and replicate where we are successful.

Dr. Porcelli suggested this is a concern at BOCES as well. He suggested that BOCES utilize the graphic arts program to have an advertising campaign for students by students.

7.3 Technology

Dr. Shelmidine said she will be meeting with Scott Morris from BOCES about E rate and Smart Bond Money. A number of teachers want to make integrated technology more seamless. We don't have the computers to support that. We are working on a proposal and a plan to go forward. How is instruction meeting 21st Century needs will be the overarching question.

7.4 Community Book Read

Dr. Shelmidine said that she has the idea of looking at a community book read for both teachers and parents. She said she is going to post it to start after the Holidays. The four choices are *Grit* by Angela Duckworth,

Hacking the Common Core by Michael Fisher, *Creating Cultures of Thinking* by Ron Ritchhart, and *Empower* by John Spencer and A.J. Juliani. She asked that those interested email her which book they may wish to pursue.

8. Communications

8.1 From the Floor

Mr. Lachut commented that he is commending the Board for changing from the Floor to the end of the meeting.

Mrs. Crist welcomed Dr. Porcelli back. She said she was a component for indoor track last year. It was brought up to the Board last year and she is interested in hearing what the concerns are. She said she hopes the Board moves forward with indoor track. A lot of kids are very interested.

Mrs. Despina wanted to point out and publicly thank Dr. Shelmidine and Mr. Dodge for coming to the field hockey sectionals. Mrs. Despina said Dr. Porcelli did not vote for something that was BOCES funded because it was not directly for the kids. That's something to think about. She wanted her son to play basketball. He decided he truly and sincerely wants to focus on running. He wants to run, die hard runners then literally do nothing the whole winter season. It will help our program by literally running year round. Three kids want to run. You tell them to stop for October to April. Mr. Lachut raised a point. Mr. Palmer seems to be on board. There is a small bowling team, volleyball with nothing in the middle stretch. This is a time sensitive issue. Taking too long is the same as saying "no." Doing cross country and track each year you can run on your own but a lot don't know how to properly train.
