**§105. Conduct of executive sessions.

- 1. Upon a majority vote of its total membership, taken in an open meeting pursuant to a motion identifying the general area or areas of the subject or subjects to be considered, a public body may conduct an executive session for the below enumerated purposes only, provided, however, that no action by formal vote shall be taken to appropriate public moneys:
- a. matters which will imperil the public safety if disclosed;
- b. any matter which may disclose the identity of a law enforcement agent or informer;
- c. information relating to current or future investigation or prosecution of a criminal offense which would imperil effective law enforcement if disclosed;

d. discussions regarding proposed, pending or current litigation;

- e. collective negotiations pursuant to article fourteen of the civil service law;
- f. the medical, financial, credit or employment history of a particular person or corporation, or matters leading to the appointment, employment, promotion, demotion, discipline, suspension, dismissal or removal of a particular person or corporation;

g. the preparation, grading or administration of examinations; and

- h. the proposed acquisition, sale or lease of real property or the proposed acquisition of securities, or sale or exchange of securities held by such public body, but only when publicity would substantially affect the value thereof.
- 2. Attendance at an executive session shall be permitted to any member of the public body and any other persons authorized by the public body.

State Education has now required a digital equity survey to be filled out for every student and it will be eventually attached to school tools so that it will be part of our registration packet. We will start trying to do it as simply as possible family wise, so that we are not having a parent fill out five different forms. We will start it at parent conferences and keep a running list of families we still need to hear from. State Education department is asking that it be 100% completed, and we will do our best. Some of the questions asked: did the school district issue a device during the school year, what device does your child use to complete learning activities. Who provides the device, is it shared with others in the family, is that device sufficient for your child to participate in learning activities, can they access the internet at home, what is the primary service your child uses, can your child complete the full range of activities without interruptions caused by slower performance? What is the primary barrier to having sufficient internet use at home? We were asked last year to

digital equity survey, how many students did we need to provide extra, who needed the hotspot for both connectivity but also because they didn't have any access. We had a lot of that data, just not specific to each child. We are going to be working on this with this during parent conferences.

Last week, we had a round table meeting with Congresswoman Tenny; to talk about our frustration with lack of testing sites for students and teachers and the backlog and the issues we have had working with the Oneida County Department of Health. We are also going to be meeting on the 8th with our local representatives Senator Griffo, Assemblywoman Buttenschon, and all representatives for all 12 districts. We will be having a luncheon and want to cement that relationship prior to budget season. Hopefully, it will make these relationships stronger.

NYS Department of health put out some guidelines that were up to the local DOH's to follow, Oneida County is not going to follow them. One is a test to stay. One of the things we are finding is a student may be quarantined because of the proximity on a bus or they are asymptomatic and they have been quarantined because of proximity but they continuously test negative. NY State is proposing that we could have a test to stay, the student would test every single day for 7 days and if they remain asymptomatic and negative, they could stay in school for that day. Obviously students would follow all of our written protocols and we would still have to do contract tracing. This is an option that has been proposed by the NY State Department of Health.

One of the local school districts actually contacted the County Department of Health asking Dr. Gilmore to come in and meet and talk and try to resolve some problems. Dr. Gilmore told the Superintendent it would not be productive and he would not be coming to meet. This is the attitude that we have been getting from the DOH, to problem solve and really figure out how we can best meet the needs of our communities.
