NYM Principal's Update-Grades 7-12

November 2023

Good afternoon! October went by in a flash.....it was a "spirited" month full of fun! Students and staff alike were very enthusiastic about spirit week and other homecoming traditions. Thank you to Student Council for sponsoring and planning the activities!

Over the past few weeks we have been taking a close look at attendance-including student tardies and how they are impacting academics and -- the connection is clear! Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school year, or about 18 days in most school districts, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's just two days a month and that's known as chronic absence. If you add tardies to the equation the number for 1st and sometimes 2nd period classes missed rises causing an even more dramatic impact on student achievement in those courses. Please encourage and insist your children get to school on time when they are not ill. Attendance truly is the easiest way to boost student learning outcomes.

Also, keep in mind that the NY Mills UFSD Board of Education policies include an "Extracurricular Participation Policy" that requires students maintain certain academic standards and be present in school to participate in sports and extracurricular clubs -- tardies are included for consideration in this policy.

Here is an excerpt from the policy regarding attendance and tardies:

"A student who is absent or tardy because of personal illness during the afternoon session of a school day may not practice or participate in any games scheduled, rehearsals, performances or activities for that day or night. A student, in order to participate in practice, rehearsal, activity or athletic contest scheduled for that day or night, must be in attendance for **the full day** of the scheduled event in order to participate. A Friday absence because of illness may exclude a student from playing on Saturday. However, there remains the possibility that the student may sufficiently recover. Parent(s)/Guardian(s) permission in this instance is required for the student to play on Saturday."

A full-day means students are in their homerooms by the 7:45 bell and present in school until 2:05. I have been working with Ms. Rys, our Athletic Director to clarify and emphasize this with students and coaches for the upcoming Winter sports season. Please help us by reinforcing this at home. The full policy can be viewed in our online or hard copy student handbook or on the website under the Board of Education tab.
