Message from the Superintendent -

Dear Residents,

It is truly hard to believe that February is upon us. I am hopeful that half of winter is behind us and soon temperatures will warm up and our students will be out on fields and the track.

Recently the state released accountability information regarding every school and district in the state under federal guidelines. With the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) comes a new designation for New York Mills. Originally the District was identified as a Focus District due to the performance of our students with disabilities. A lot of work, by everyone, has occurred to address concerns that came with that designation. We now have students of all ability levels in co-teaching learning environments. We have made some curriculum adjustments, and will continue with that work as New York state adopts the Next Generation Learning Standards. We are formalizing a system of benchmarks and data review that informs our instruction and allows us to use that data to personalize the learning for our students.

Districts that were designated Focus for the 2017-18 school year were to be identified as Target Districts with the ESSA rollout. We were hopeful that with the increased participation in the state assessments that translated into clear success especially in grades 4 and 5, the district would no longer be identified. District and building wide-our Students with Disabilities (SWD) are all in good standing, which was a primary area of concern with the Focus designation. In fact, many of our students, when looking at groups by demographics, are in good standing.

Given that schools are institutions that are constantly in a state of continuous improvement, there remains one area that has the secondary program identified as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school and that would be for our middle level mathematics growth scores. So, what does this all mean? In short, our curriculum work and data review work, especially in math instruction grades K-8 needs to be a priority with grade level and across grade level conversations that address gaps in our students' understanding of key concepts. Those priorities are also areas we are addressing regardless of content or grade level.

On February 28, 2019, at 7:00 p.m. in the cafeteria there will be a parent presentation on ESSA and on our designations as a CSI school and a Target district. I hope to see you there.


Drama Club Presents: The Little Mermaid
