

Emergency "Go Home" Drill

On **Tuesday**, **November 21**, an Emergency Go Home Drill will be conducted at every school within our Oneida-Herkimer-Madison BOCES area. New York State Education Law requires that we hold this drill each year at least 15 minutes before the normal dismissal time. The purpose of the drill is to prepare students, staff and parents for an emergency that would require us to immediately send all students home. The fastest way to evacuate the building and safely transport students home (or to an alternate safe location) is via our school buses.

You and your child should have a set plan for a safe drop-off within the school district if we need to send all students home in an emergency.

Please talk to your child about your plan before Tuesday, November 21, so that there is no confusion on that afternoon.

Also, for grades K-6 students, it is important to send a revised "Emergency School Closing Plan" to school if your emergency drop-off location has changed. There will be no parent pick-ups from school during this drill. In a true emergency, parent pick-ups would not be possible in most cases. The following is the schedule for this year's drill:

1:55 p.m. - Grades 7-12 students and staff will evacuate the building. All grades 7-12 students will board buses at that time. No parent pick-ups will be accommodated on November 21. Students scheduled for after-school activities may remain on their bus and will be returned to school after the drill concludes.

2:45 p.m. – Grades K-6 students and staff will evacuate the building. All grades K-6 students will board buses at that time. No parent pick-ups will be accommodated on November 21 and there will be no K-6 YMCA Child Care Program that day.

Thank you for your assistance with our annual Emergency Go Home Drill. We anticipate a smooth and speedy dismissal on Tuesday, November 21. Please feel free to call your child's school office if you have questions or concerns. There will be no school on November 22–24 due to the Thanksgiving break.

Mr. Eramo Selected as Mohawk Valley Master Teacher

Michael Eramo has been selected as one of the Mohawk Valley regions 23 new Master Teachers. The New York State Master Teacher Program celebrates the work of the highest-preforming STEM teachers by establishing an expert community dedicated to developing expertise in the areas of content, pedagogy, and students' families and communities. Mr. Eramo, New York Mills 8th grade science and physics teacher, is the third New York Mills teacher to be selected for the program and will join current Master Teachers, Sarah Gates and Audrey Foote.





School News

7th Grade Science Stream Ecology Project

Seventh grade science students in Miss Foote's class have been working with the Onondaga Environmental Institute to study the health of the Mohawk River watershed. Once a week, Ms. Amy Samuels and Dr. Stephanie Johnson visit science classes to teach students about watersheds, their importance, and how to assess stream and river health. On October 10, science students visited four streams and learned how to visually conduct water quality tests and collect macro invertebrates, which they later identified at school. At the conclusion of this project, students will have an understanding of how ecologists monitor stream and watershed health, as well as how ecologists can restore the health of these bodies of water.











Students Visit Munson-Williams

Late in September, the junior class and students from the Modern American Society class visited Munson-Williams Art Institute to see the exhibit "Roaring into the Future: A look at New York from 1925-1930." The exhibit connects to literature being taught and the time periods that are discussed in each class. Students were divided into several groups and given a walking tour of the exhibit. They were able see items and products that were created in our state during this timeframe, and learn about how our area was developing in the early 1920s-1930s. The tour guides also discussed historical and societal events that affected our nation during those years.





Curling

Regents Chemistry students had the opportunity to earn some extra credit by trying something slightly different ... curling! Chemistry students learned how to deliver a stone and sweep at the Utica Curling Club in early October. Perhaps we will see some of them on the ice in Beijing in 2022!

All for One, and One for All

On October 3, Ms. Viel's freshmen and Mrs. Hartmann's creative writing students traveled to Syracuse Stage to see the swashbuckling spectacular *The Three Musketeers*. Students enjoyed learning about Alexandre Dumas' classic tale of intrigue, adventure, and romance. Aside from the varying plotlines within the story, the students learned the symbolic nature of the number three in literature. Hence, things that come in threes are naturally funnier, more satisfying, or more effective than other numbers of things. A series of three is often used to create a progression in which the tension is created, then built up, and finally released (such as in "The Three Little Pigs" or "Goldilocks and the Three Bears"). The student feedback from seeing live theater was sheer excitement and positivity.

An area that can determine student success is attendance. Students who miss school miss the conversations surrounding the topics taught. Students who miss 10% of school days are considered by the state education department as chronically absent. Students who are chronically absent in the elementary school are less likely to be able to read at grade level. Chronic absence in the middle school is an early indicator of academic struggles and in the high school it can be a better indicator than test scores of student struggles. Doing make up work, although important, does not begin to capture the discussions, and explanations offered in class. Please try not to schedule vacations, etc. when school is in session. When children miss school they miss out and we miss them!
