Kseniya Avrusevich, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Vladimir Avrusevich has been awarded with the **LeMoyne College Heights Award**. LeMoyne College offers the opportunity to receive a \$12,500 annual scholarship, which is renewable for up to four years. In addition, Kseniya has also received the **RIT computing medal**. Computing medal recipients who are admitted as a full-time undergraduate student at RIT are guaranteed to receive an RIT Computing Medal scholarship worth \$3,000 per year.

Katelyn DiViccaro, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Edward DiViccaro, has been nominated for the **University of Rochester Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony Award**. This award was named in honor of two of Rochester's most significant pioneers of social justice. Upon application, Katelyn will be automatically considered for this scholarship, which is worth at least \$10,000 per year (totaling at least \$40,000 over four years.)

Kenneth Egan, son of Mr. & Mrs. Kenneth Egan has been awarded the **Clarkson Leadership Award**, for which the recipient earns a scholarship of \$60,000 over four years. In addition, Ken has received the **University of Rochester Xerox Award for Innovation and Information Technology**. Recognition as a nominee of the Xerox Award is an outstanding opportunity that would be worth at least \$10,000 per year (totaling at least \$40,000 over four years) upon acceptance to the University of Rochester.

Christina Malinowski, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Walter Malinowski, has received the University of **Rochester Bausch & Lomb Honorary Science Award**. This is given in recognition of the achievements of an outstanding science and math student. Christina has also earned the **Elmira College Key Award** This scholarship, should Christina apply and be accepted, would award her with \$60,000 over a four-year period.

Elizabeth McAllister, daughter of Mr. Jesse McAllister has received the **Sage Colleges Student Sage Award**. Elizabeth is guaranteed a minimum of \$5,000 toward tuition at Russell Sage College or Sage College of Albany with a possible total scholarship of \$15,000. This scholarship is available for up to four years of study.

Janlynn McCoy, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Kevin McCoy has earned the **Wells College 21st Century Leadership Award** for outstanding contributions she has made as a student and a leader. As a recipient, she is awarded a \$40,000 Scholarship for Leaders (\$10,000 per year) for four years of study at Wells College.

John Mitchell, son of Mr. & Mrs. John Mitchell Sr., has received the **Sage Colleges Student Sage Award**. John is guaranteed a minimum of \$5,000 toward tuition at Russell Sage College or Sage College of Albany with a possible total scholarship of \$15,000. Rachel Siegel, daughter of Ms. Gail Siegel, has been awarded with the RPI **Rensselaer Medal** which is awarded to a secondary student who has distinguished him /herself in mathematics and science. In addition, she has also received the **Rochester Institute of Technology Innovation & Creativity Award**, which qualifies her for an annual scholarship worth \$7,000.

Claudia Spost, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Michael Spost has received the Clarkson Achievement Award, which earns her a scholarship of \$12,000 per year and a total of \$48,000 over four years upon acceptance to Clarkson University. Claudia has also earned the University of Rochester George Eastman Young Leaders Award. If Claudia applies and is accepted to the University of Rochester, she will be considered for a scholarship worth at least \$10,000 per year (totaling at least \$40,000 over four years).


Jordyn is a past Student of the Month and has been inducted into our chapters of the National Junior Honor Society and National Honor Society.

Varsity Baseball

The New York Mills Varsity Baseball Team had another good season posting a record of (11-3) league and (18-4) overall in the Center State Conference. On May 26, 2016 the Marauders were ranked #5 in New York State. On May 5, 2016 the Marauders had the opportunity to play at Double Day Field in Cooperstown, N.Y. against #2 Heuvelton who they defeated 5-2. In the Month of May, the Marauders went on to win 12 games losing just two. In Sectional play the Marauders went 2-1 defeating Remsen and Madison, losing to Oriskany in the Sectional semi-final. The team was led by seniors Griffin Baur, Dalton Henry, Brandon Ross, Mike Copperwheat, Terry Nichols and Brian Coughlin. The other players who contributed to the successful season are: Rob Maciol, Nick Briggs, Jake Venarro, Joe Marchese, Alex Matrassi and Matt Centolella. Three Players were voted 1st Team Center State Conference All-Stars: Dalton Henry, Catcher, with a Batting average of .429; Griffin Baur, Pitcher, with a Batting average of .414; and Brandon Ross, Infielder, with a Batting average of .397. Three players were also voted Center State Conference 2nd Team All-Stars: Nick Briggs, Infielder/Outfielder, with a Batting average of .295; Jake Venarro, Pitcher, with a record of 6-0; and Terry Nichols, Infielder.

Varsity Softball

The 2016 varsity softball squad improved greatly from the beginning of the season until the final game.

Several team and individual goals were accomplished. These include: offensive and defensive improvements, team chemistry, a better understanding of softball and four important wins. The highlights this season were a comeback win over Remsen and two very competitive games to end the season vs. State ranked opponents. Senior Brittany Fucillo was an outstanding leader on and off the field. Juniors Chloe Cattadorris and Alyssa Fucillo led the marauders offensively and defensively.

The future is very bright for the softball team as 10 girls are expected to return. The Lady Marauders will participate at a summer league in New Hartford in order to begin preparing for 2017. This was by far one of the most coachable groups Coach Smith has worked within his 30 years of coaching softball.

Golf

The 2016 New York Mills Boys Golf Team just finished another outstanding season. Their league record was 8-2 and overall record was 10-2.

One highlight of the year was beating rival Oriskany in both matches played. Another bright spot was the team's 2nd place finish in the Section 3 golf tournament held at Twin Ponds Golf & Country Club. Dalton Brown, a senior on the team, qualified for the State Qualifier At Colgate University: Seven Oaks Golf Course. Dalton's fine play allowed him to participate in both the second and third day of state qualifying; a difficult and rare feat.

To end the season, Dalton Brown and Cameron Soja finished 3rd out of 22 schools in the 2-man CSC team tournament; Dalton shot a 75, good enough for 3rd place overall.
