ATTENDANCE MATTERS

DID YOU KNOW?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher



has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly

helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit from the first day of school, so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Remember, every day missed is a day of instruction missed, a day of classroom interaction with students and teachers that can't be recovered. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work. *Please remember that tardiness and check-outs count as absences from subjects.* When your child is not in school he/she is missing valuable education.

Remember, students may be retained due to poor attendance.

WANTED: FAMILY ENGAGMENT

What is one of the proven predictors of academic achievement? Studies show that a family's engagement has a direct positive impact on a child's learning success.

Family Engagement = Student Success

When families are engaged in their

children's school lives, students have the home support they need to develop a lifelong love of learning.

Children with families engaged in their education are more likely to:

- Earn higher grades and test scores.
- Graduate from high school and

attend post-secondary education.

- Develop self-confidence and motivation in the classroom.
- Have better social skills and classroom behavior.

They are also less likely to:

- Suffer from low self-esteem
- Require redirection in the classroom.
- Develop behavioral issues.

Drop Off/Pick Up Procedures

Car riding K-2 students are dropped off at GES. Drop-off times are 7:10 -7:45 AM. Students are tardy at 7:45 AM. Parents must sign in tardy students. If your child is tardy, park in the 2nd lane at W. O. Parmer Elementary and **WALK YOUR CHILD** into the building. Pick up begins at 2:40 PM in front of W. O. Parmer. Kindergarten is in the lane closest to the building, first grade is in the middle lane, and second grade will be n the lane farthest from the building.

Bright Beginnings students' hours are from 7:45 AM -2:15 PM. Bright Beginnings drop-off begins at 7:45 AM (Use the lane closest to the building). Do not line up before 7:40 AM, as buses are unloading until 7:40 AM. Bright Beginning students will be picked up behind the old Second grade building, starting at 2:15 PM.
