

How is the food prepared?


The food is prepared whenever it is close to your breakfast and lunch time to make sure everything is hot and fresh.

How does it make you feel that Monday-Friday you have to come to Right Choices to bring us breakfast and lunch?


I honestly love bringing the breakfast and lunch from Battery Creek to Right Choices.

IF YOU DON'T THINK YOU NEED DRUG AND ALCOHOL COUNSELING......THINK AGAIN!

Does your school provide you with drug and alcohol counseling? Well, at Right Choices we have a counselor named Ms. Williams who is available four days a week at the Mink Point site. Ms. Williams provides the students with individual and group counseling. You don't have to be a student who is an active drug or alcohol user to talk to her. You can go to Ms. Williams to discuss your curiosities and to learn more about the effects of drug and alcohol use on your body.

Can you explain why people get addicted to drugs?

People get addicted to drugs for many reasons: experimental, environmental, family, friends, or they just want to be included.

How would you classify different drugs?

- Hallucinogens: LSD, PCP, cannabis, ecstasy [Hallucinogens are drugs that have you seeing things that no one else is seeing.]
- **Stimulants:** alcohol, methamphetamine, cocaine [Stimulants are drugs that can make a person feel more awake, alert, confident, or energetic.]

How would you estimate how many high schoolers do drugs?

About 35 out of 100 students use drugs and this number could be much higher.

What do you notice about drug addicts?

- They don't feel like they have a problem
- They feel that they can stop at anytime
- They feel that it is their life and they can live it how they want too!

What is more addictive drugs or alcohol?

It depends on age, usage, and weight when it comes to alcohol. Older people tend to be more addicted to prescription medication.

What would you use to classify a person an addict?

There are 13 criteria to classify a person as an addict below I will give you five:

- 1. period of use
- 2. cravings
- 3. withdrawal symptoms
- 4. unsuccessful attempts to cut down use
- 5. giving up important activities to use

How are drugs related to high school dropouts?

Students prefer to get high which hinders one from doing his or her schoolwork.

What conclusion can you draw about drug users?

Life events play a huge role in why a person may use drugs. They may feel like no one loves or cares about them so they use substances as a way to finding that love. They will find others that use and they believe that they found the love that they had been longing for from family and friends.

What advice would you give to high schoolers that are thinking about doing drugs?

My advice to them is "not to do it" because substance use:

- wrecks lives
- causes negative behaviors
- can lead to a road of destruction

Should kids go to drug and alcohol counseling even if they aren't using or interested in drug or alcohol use?

Yes, the reason being they may not be using but they can get the education to help someone else who may be using to help save their lives.

Now that you learned about our drug and alcohol counselor's role, it is time for you to seek out the drug and alcohol counselor at your school if you may be a substance abuse user, have questions, or want advice on how to help someone who may need support from a counselor!

What do you do in your office?

When I am in my office sometimes I review reports, I am making police reports, send emails, and doing training.

What keeps you motivated?

I like working with kids and getting to know them.

How do you deal with disruptive students?

How do you feel when people call you 12?

It doesn't bother me!

How do you feel about arresting kids?

I have two other roles outside of being an SRO. I am an Emergency Management Specialist (EMD) that responds to disasters and I am a Tactical Flight Officer who flies in a helicopter and operates the forward-looking infared or FLIR camera and mapping system during searches. I am also required to continuously train for all of the roles I have with the Beaufort County Sheriff's Department.

Now that you have learned about our school SRO, I hope you better understand the role of the SRO and that they are here to support the students, staff, and the community! Also that Sgt. Smith's role outside of the Beaufort County South Carolina School District as an Emergency Management Specialist (EMD) responding during disasters and a Tactical Flight Officer who flies in a helicopter to assist with searches, provides the community with multiple levels of support!

When asked how she likes all of her jobs?

Sgt. Smith said "It's fun!"

Ms. Couch has more than 25 years of teaching experience. She is one of the educators at the Right Choices Program that has been here for two and a half years. Ms. Couch is a good listener. BINARY CODING AT RIGHT CHOICES

Have you ever used the binary code? Think again! The binary code has been around since ancient times. It had been discovered that a form of the binary code can be traced back to ancient Egypt, China, and India. According to convertbinary.com, ancient Egyptians used "horus-Eyes" fractions to measure and count grains and liquids as early as 2400 B.C.E. The binary code that we use today was created in 1679 by Gottfried Wilhelm Leibniz and published in 1703 in an article called *Explication de l'Arithmétique Binaire*.

What is the binary code used for today? Well, according to convertbinary.com the binary system is used to operate digital circuits in computers. In other words, this means that binary code sends signals that are used to perform specific task. For example, when you strike the uppercase letter A on your keyboard, you are actually sending your computer processor 01000001.

So if you think you don't know much about the binary code.....think again!



mended to read it by one of my friends. At first, I thought it's going to be really boring but after reading two or three pages I found the book to be interesting.





Do you know what "pickleball" is or do you want to know? Well today I'm going to tell you everything there is to know about it!

Pickleball is a sport that two to four people can play. You need a paddle, ball, a court, and a net. According to usapickleball.org, this is one of the fastest growing sports in the United States today with 4.6 million players and growing.

How did the pickleball game get created?

This all started in 1965 when two congressmen Joel Pritchard and Bill Bell were at Pritchard's home and decided they wanted to play a family game. They were lacking equipment to play a game called badminton. Without enough equipment they started playing with ping-pong paddles and a 60 inch net. Soon enough they realized 60 inches was too high and lowered it to 36 inches. It was in the backyard of Joel Pritchard's house in Virginia where the first official pickleball court was made!

How do you play pickleball?

Pickleball is played with two to four players. Every pickleball game starts with a serve. The server must serve underhanded from behind the baseline. The serve must be diagonally across the service court. So if you are serving from the left, you serve the ball diagonally to the left side. This rule is the same if you serve from the right side. After the first serve the ball must bounce once before the opposing team can return it back. If a point is scored, the serving team continues switching sides until a fault is committed. A fault is an action that stops play because of a rule violation. A fault by the receiving team results in a point for the serving team. A fault by the serving team results in loss of serve.

What is the kitchen/non-volley zone?

The kitchen (non-volley zone) is pretty clear. What it means is that you can't step in or on the kitchen line while returning the ball after a serve. If you volley in the kitchen, it is considered a fault volley within the kitchen. It is a fault if after volleying the ball you gain momentum and accidently step in the kitchen, even if the volley is considered dead. A player can be in the kitchen as long as they want if they're not volleying there.

Point System

The team that serves is the only one who gains points. Most games are played to 11 points. In all games you must have two points higher than the opposing team to win.

*volley is a ball hit in the air before it bounces onto the court during a rally.

*rally the continuous back and forth that occurs after the service but before a fault https://primetimepickleball.com/what-is-a-rally-in-pickleball/

*dead is the term used to describe the pickleball after a fault is declared.

So if you are in the Beaufort County, SC area and you have not tried playing pickleball, head over to the Burton Wells Recreation Complex because according to *The Island News*, on October 5 there was a ribbon cutting ceremony celebrating the opening of six new pickleball courts. I think you should put this on your "to do list". Pickleball is easy to learn, gets you off social media and active, and is something fun to do with your friends and family!

- · Relevant: important, significant, necessary
- Timely: can be accomplished in a reasonable amount of time

How do students decide the scope or how big the goal should be? This all depends on the students' success rate of accomplishing their previous goals.

Some common types of goals are to:

- o Increase something
- o Make something
- o Improve something
- o Reduce something
- o Save something
- o Develop someone (yourself!)

Here at Right Choices students learn about four different types of goals:

- personal
- social
- academic
- career

If you think setting and accomplishing a SMART goal is easy, then think again!


Let's look at an example of an academic SMART goal that a student could set and attain.

Specific: I will complete all 10 missing assignments in Google Classroom and submit them to my ELA teacher in two weeks before the marking period ends.

Measurable: The measurement is that as I complete the assignments and submit them in Google Classroom, I can count how many more assignments I need to submit.

Attainable: This is attainable because I know which assignments are missing and I can complete one missing assignment each day to attain this goal.


Relevant: This is relevant because without completing and submitting these late assignments within two weeks, I will fail the ELA course.

Timely: The assignments must be completed and submitted in Google Classroom within 2 weeks from now or I will fail the ELA course.
