Mt. Gilead Middle School Earns Top-Honors, District "Exceeds Standards" in State Report Card

Mount Gilead Schools "Exceed State Standards," says the Ohio Department of Education 2022-2023 Report Card released for districts across Ohio on Thursday. Mount Gilead Middle School, independently, scored 5 stars.

"I am proud to announce that our district earned a 4 star overall rating which means we are exceeding state standards for our students at Mt. Gilead," remarked Emily Ross, MGEVS Director of Curriculum and Instruction. "This is the first year with overall star ratings on the report card and is evidence of just how much ground we have regained since COVID. While there are always areas for improvement, the High School and Middle School should be especially proud as they earned 4.5 & 5 stars respectively for their building ratings."

After the COVID-19 pandemic, the Ohio Department of Education switched from a letter grade to a "star" based score. A three-star rating "meets state standards", a five "significantly exceeds standards", and a one "needs significant support to meet state standards."

This means the Middle School is no longer a "Focus" school building requiring additional compliance measures for the state," The district received 3 stars, or higher, meeting or exceeding state expectations in Achievement (Performance Index on State tests); Progress (Expected growth on state tests); Gap Closing (how our student subgroups are improving); Graduation rate (looks at 4-year and 5-year rates); and Early Literacy (focus on K-3 on/off track, 3rd grade Reading Guarantee, and Promotion to 4th Grade).


NEW - Standards Based Grade Card for Park Ave Students

Starting this fall Mount Gilead Schools are rolling out more detailed Standards based grade cards for Park Avenue. While a grade percentage is still calculated in the traditional manner, we are using a new Letter grade scale to help shift our focus towards mastery of standards. We want families to know exactly what students are learning and where they have strengths or need support. This is not possible with traditional averages and Alpha grade scales. In the new letter scale E is for Exceeds the standard, and would be similar to an A. M is for Mastered the standard, and is similar to a B. P is Progressing to the standard, and would be similar to a C, and L is Limited Growth on the standard, and would be like a D.

As a student progresses through the year, not all standards will be assessed each quarter. Subjects like Math build on prior skills while other topics like **Opinion Writing may only** be taught in one quarter. By the end of the year each standard will have been taught and assessed on the report card. If you are looking at your students' grades in PowerSchool, when you click on the grade for a class you can see all the assignments and standards included in that grade.

In the Kitchen with Food Service Director Autumn Pauley (apauley@mgschools.org)

As we wrap up the first quarter of school some helpful things to remember from your school cafeteria:

- 1. Has your income changed? Did you know that you can fill out a free and reduced application anytime of the year? Not only does the application possibly help you but it also helps the district with grants too. Also for this year only did you know that reduced students don't have to pay for school lunch!
- 2. Did you remember that last year the school board voted in a Charge policy? The charge policy lets your student charge up to \$75.00 in school meals. That is roughly 17 days that your student can charge a breakfast and lunch meal. But remember you will need to pay that amount back! We send home negative balance letters monthly, please don't ignore these letters, pay on your student's negative balance, as this debt carries from year to year with them. If your student charges more than \$75.00 your student will receive a USDA meal, that is not the menued option.



- 3. Remember our apps we have to help make school lunches easier. With PaySchools Central (https:// payschoolscentral.com/) you can fill out a free and reduced application, put money on your students account, or even see what your student is buying each day. NutriSlice (https://mtgilead.nutrislice.com/menu) is where you can see what is on the lunch menu for each building.
- 4. Are you running late and your student is saying they are hungry? Did you know that each morning your student can come to school and get breakfast for only \$1.50 (paid student), or if your student is free or reduced breakfast is free this year. Even on school delay's we offer breakfast each day.
- 5. Each building has multiple options for students to choose from each day, for both breakfast and lunch. If your student doesn't like what is on the menu for that day, there are other options to choose from. At the Middle and high school we offer pizza every day at lunch. At the elementary we offer deli sandwiches and peanut butter and jelly. Those are only some of the options each day.

Thanksgiving Feast Available to all Students

MG Schools Food Service will celebrate our students with a special Thanksgiving holiday feast! Middle and High School will have roast turkey and gravy, mashed potatoes and vegetable on Wednesday, November 15th. Park Avenue students will enjoy the same on Thursday, November 16th. This special meal will be charged just like a regular meal.





The crew worked to clean up the grounds of the dog park and playground to help it look much better. They collected approximately 10-12 big bags of yard waste.

























Cherry Street Gymnasium Getting a Facelift

- The entire roof has been repaired and recoated for the Cherry Street Building
- The Gym's wood floor has been replaced and the striping is nearly complete

- New PA System installed
- Side Courts have been updated with glass backboards
- The ceiling and walls have been painted
