### 3) Superintendent Report

#### **Superintendent Josh Hurt**

- Introduced guests: Bill Adams from Studer Education, Adair County Superintendent Jason Faulkner
- Nothing new tonight on the construction project at the high school. Bids will be sent out between now and the next board meeting.
- The auditor has provided a summary of his findings to the board members. Financially, we are doing ok as a district.
- If the board approves agenda item 5B, KETS 1<sup>st</sup> offer of assistance for \$14,763, the district is required to match that amount. The funds go toward technology.
- On agenda item 5E, the window to purchase new buses is opening soon. We have been late on the process in the past, which has delayed the arrival of our new buses. While we don't know if we will buy any new buses for next year, we want to make sure we have the board's approval to do so (up to two new buses.) Currently, we have five new buses on the way, which adds to the two buses that were previously purchased with ESSER funds, bringing the total number of new buses to 7.
- The School Report Card has been released. We have some good news to report from Mrs. Dial.

- It has been a great start to the school year.
- We had productive literacy training on election day with GRREC personnel leading the professional development for teachers and staff.

MCMS grew in all areas with an increase of 26 points overall. The school improved from orange to yellow and was only one point away from green. Very proud of all of the staff at MCMS for their dedication and commitment to helping each student.
- In October, Beta hosted a great fall formal for students.
- Veteran's Day was celebrated on Nov. 10 with a wonderful program completed by student ambassadors and student leaders at MCMS and MCHS. The veterans were very thankful for the American flag artwork completed by Nikki Jolly's class.
- Mrs. Jolly was recently chosen by KY Innovative Teacher Fellowship. Out of 40 candidates, she was one of 10 chosen to complete innovative projects in the classroom.

- The deeper learning team is continuing to work on the Portrait of a Graduate. **Mr. Hurt:** *The test scores are important but don't describe the entire picture. While I am certainly proud that our scores improved, I'm really proud of our growth, which is a sign of real learning. The middle school is arguably the most improved middle school in the state of Kentucky. The elementary grew by ten points academically. The high school also improved academically. The high school struggled with the post-secondary readiness component of KSA. They have an improvement plan in place. We have a lot of positive momentum, and I'm very proud of our students, teachers, and staff.*


