

Teachers Are Struggling to Afford Our Communities

What you may not know is that, in recent years, our high schools have been losing top teacher talent to neighboring districts and more affordable communities. Due to inadequate state funding and stagnant local revenue, LGSUHSD teacher compensation has not kept pace with similar districts. Given that Los Gatos and Saratoga are among the most expensive communities in the country, teachers struggle to live here.

Exploring Locally Controlled Funding Solutions to Keep Top Teacher Talent

The District is actively exploring options to keep qualified teachers in our high schools and maintain the level of academic excellence our community has come to expect. For more than a decade, our schools have relied on Measure A, a \$49 annual parcel tax that provides dedicated, locally controlled funding to attract and retain qualified teachers and maintain a wide array of academic offerings, including robotics, rigorous AP courses and award-winning music, arts and world language programs.


Since Measure A was first approved in 2011, the cost of living and of providing an excellent education has continued to increase, yet Measure A's \$49 rate has never been increased. The Role Local Funding Plays in Keeping Top Teachers & Protecting Excellent Academics

As the LGSUHSD Board of Trustees begins considering a potential ballot measure to renew the District's expiring local parcel tax, it might be helpful to understand how specifically local funds could be spent in local high schools. With a modest increase to the \$49 rate first approved more than 10 years ago, funding from a renewal measure could continue to support key District initiatives, including:

- Attracting and retaining highly qualified teachers and school staff
- Maintaining strong core academic programs and high-quality science, math, technology, robotics, engineering and AP courses
- Providing programs that prepare students for college and future careers
- Supporting high student achievement
- Ensuring teacher salaries are competitive with surrounding districts

Local Control & Fiscal Accountability Provisions Are Required in Local Funding Measures

- ✓ All proceeds are controlled locally and cannot be taken away by the State
- No money can be used for administrators' salaries or pensions
- Independent citizens' oversight and mandatory annual audits are required
- Senior citizen homeowners are eligible for an exemption from the cost
