**VIII. Student Representative's Report**

*Ms. Sum reported that she did a student survey at the beginning of the year on various topics. Based on the responses, she reported that students are happy and very receptive to the new teachers. Students were also very excited about new course offerings such as piano and AP computer science. They felt the new courses help them prepare for college. Students are taking advantage of the internships being offered. Many positive experiences, such as being able to participate at a meeting in BMW and teaching a 1<sup>st</sup> grade class. The laptop rollout went well but some students had problems when bringing their computers home. One problem is the battery life. There is an upcoming visit from German exchange students. Many of the students are excited to have them come. The students feel it helps them experience different cultures. They have inquired about exchange programs for other languages. The marching band placed first in their group. The theater program held auditions for the fall drama "Time Flies." Rehearsals begin tomorrow. GSA and SADD Clubs are allowing students to meet others who are opened-minded. Students expressed increased interest in language and photography classes. There was also interest expressed in having higher level middle school courses. A total of 40 students responded.*

**IX. President's Report**

*President Bruno reported that he attended Back-To-School night at the High School. He thanked the staff for running a successful event. He thought it was very informative but commented that it seemed lightly attended.*

**X. Superintendent's Report**

 **HIB Update**

*Dr. Gamper thanked the staff for getting the year off to a great start. HIB had two investigations at the High School. Both were confirmed as HIB. There were no reports at either elementary school.*

*East Brook will have their Back-to-School night tomorrow, The Middle School will have it on Wednesday and West Ridge will have their's on Thursday. Dr. Gamper reported that he attended the PTO meetings at both schools. He felt there was a good crowd in attendance.*

*On October 17<sup>th</sup>, the Board will be asking the public to give input into the long-range facility plan. He encouraged staff to come to the meeting.*

*The German Exchange Program will start on October 14<sup>th</sup> and run through November 4<sup>th</sup>. He attended a meeting with Mr. Lederman and Mrs. Erdman. Mrs. Erdman raised concerns about safety traveling abroad. Both Mrs. Erdman and school staff did not feel comfortable chaperoning the trip.*

*Mr. Sileo commented that he is not a fan of these trips. He requested more information on security.*

*President Bruno stated that if we cannot get chaperones, the point is moot. With the current state of affairs, he could not blame the staff. He felt the Board owed it to students to research the matter further.*

*Mr. Sileo asked what the issues were with the French trip. Dr. Gamper responded that the French government pulled their funding.*

*Mr. Sileo asked if the German students are still coming. Dr. Gamper responded that they are. He also commented that there is nothing stopping parents from making direct connections with German families if they want their children to go there in the summer.*

*The Buildings and Grounds Committee met and discussed the portico project. President Bruno explained that it is a two-phase project. The first phase was to power wash the structure to ascertain what repair work is needed. The next phase will be to repair it. **Section 1.** The Refunding Bond Ordinance attached hereto as Exhibit A is hereby approved. Bond Counsel is hereby authorized and directed to publish the required notice of public hearing for the Refunding Bond Ordinance to be held on October 17, 2016 in The Record, in the form and at the time required by N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.4.

**EXHIBIT A**

**REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF ALL OR A PORTION OF ITS OUTSTANDING CALLABLE SCHOOL BONDS, SERIES 2010 DATED JUNE 2, 2010, ISSUED IN THE ORIGINAL PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$7,524,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$5,210,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF REFUNDING SCHOOL BONDS TO EFFECT SUCH REFUNDING**

**WHEREAS**, on June 2, 2010, The Board of Education of the Borough of Park Ridge in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the “Board” when referring to the governing body and the “School District” when referring to the territorial boundaries governed by the Board) issued \$7,524,000 aggregate principal amount of tax-exempt School Bonds, Series 2010 dated June 2, 2010 (the “2010 School Bonds”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Board has determined that the current tax-exempt interest rate environment may enable it to realize going-forward debt service savings for property taxpayers residing in the School District through the issuance by the Board of Refunding School Bonds (the “Refunding School Bonds”) to refund all or a portion of the \$4,659,000 aggregate principal amount of the outstanding 2010 School Bonds maturing on or after August 15, 2021 (the “Refunded Bonds”); and

**WHEREAS**, in efforts to realize such taxpayer savings, the Board now desires to adopt and enact a refunding school bond ordinance (the “Refunding Bond Ordinance”) authorizing the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$5,210,000 (the “Refunding School Bonds”), in one or more series of Bonds, the net proceeds of which shall be used to refund all or a portion of the Refunded Bonds in accordance with their terms; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF PARK RIDGE IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** The Board is hereby authorized to refund all or a portion of the \$4,659,000 aggregate principal amount of the outstanding 2010 School Bonds maturing on or after August 15, 2021.

**Section 2.** In order to finance the cost of the purposes set forth in Section 1 hereof, the Board is hereby authorized to issue not to exceed \$5,210,000 aggregate principal amount of Refunding School Bonds, all in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61 through 62, which Refunding School Bonds may be issued in one or more multiple series.

**Section 3.** An aggregate amount not exceeding \$100,000 may be allocated from the aggregate principal amount of the Refunding School Bonds to pay for the aggregate costs of issuance for the Refunding School Bonds, including, but not limited to, bond insurance premiums, underwriting fees, official statement printing fees, public advertisement expenses, refunding verification agent fees, refunding escrow agent fees, bond counsel fees and other expenses in connection therewith.

**Section 4.** The purpose of the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds is to realize net present value interest cost savings for property taxpayers residing in the School District (“net” meaning savings after payment of all costs of issuance of the Refunding School Bonds). Applicable State requirements mandate that such net present value interest cost savings equal at least 3% of the principal amount of the Refunded Bonds. In addition, the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds shall comply with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 5:30-2.5, including that within 10 days of the date of the closing on the Refunding School Bonds, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall file a report with the Local Finance Board within the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs setting forth (a) a comparison of the Refunding School Bonds’ debt service and the Refunded Bonds’ debt service, which comparison shall set forth the present value savings achieved by the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; (b) a summary of the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; (c) an itemized accounting of all costs of issuance in connection with the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; and (d) a certification of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary that (i) all of the conditions of Section (b) of N.J.A.C. 5:30-2.5 have been met, and (ii) a

resolution authorizing the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds, adopted pursuant to 18A:24-61.5(b), was approved by a two-thirds vote of the full membership of the Board.

**Section 5.** The Supplemental Debt Statement required by N.J.S.A. 18A:24-16 and N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.4 has been duly prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough of Park Ridge, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the “Borough”) and in the Office of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary as of the date of approval of this Refunding Bond Ordinance and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough is increased by \$551,000 as a result of the authorization of the Refunding School Bonds.

**Section 6.** The Board covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under Section 103(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, of the interest on all Refunding School Bonds issued under this Refunding Bond Ordinance.

**Section 7.** This Refunding Bond Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption hereof.

*Mr. Roberts indicated that the protections are already available. The policy simply recognizes it.*

*Mr. Moran commented that he did not like the term "non-conforming" in the policy.*

*Mr. Roberts responded that the terminology is correct.*

*Mr. Browne asked for the motion to be tabled.*

*Mr. Roberts commented that it was only the first reading and that the Board would have another opportunity to vote on the policy.*

*Connie Washnik asked for clarification on whether the policy is required.*

*Mr. Roberts responded that students still have the protections outlined in the policy. The policy helps implement those protections. It also helps staff as to what the students' rights and their obligations are.*
