
A New Way to Connect CMCS and the Community

Whatever You Like to Do - Cal-Mum Has a Club for You!

Expanding our extracurricular opportunities for students is part of our strategic plan. We began to develop the clubs prior to the Covid pandemic interruption. Once the NYS Dept of Health guidance allowed for students to gather together, plans for several new clubs finally became a reality.

The club ideas came from teachers with an intention to provide enrichment opportunities for our students in the area of STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, mathematics). Elementary School students are taking part in one or more of the following after school clubs:

Ukulele Club, Lego Building, Keva Planks, Indy Car, Chess Club, Rigamajig, Sphero Club, Building Club, Virtual Reality, Girls on the Run, Creativity, Student Council and Page Turners.

We have had such extensive participation that some clubs needed to create additional dates and multiple groups in order to accommodate the interest of our students. In the middle/high school, students have several after school clubs to choose from including Tech Club, Baking Club, Page Turners, Chess Club, and Archery Club. A Cooking Club and American Sign Language club may be added.

The funding for many of these programs is provided by Covid federal grant money that was given to our school district.

School Social Worker Stacey Tallon Spends Recess in South American Refugee Camp

Stacey Tallon, District Social Worker, spent February break "social work style." She and her partner, Jim, a registered nurse, traveled to Tijuanna, Mexico to volunteer at the Refugee Health Alliance (FHA.)

RHA provides refugees with health care at no cost. All medical staff need to be proficient in Spanish in order to volunteer at RHA. Jim has not missed a single day



on Duolingo over the past three years. This demonstrates that it is never too late to learn something new! In the month of February 50% of the RHA patients were from Haiti, 5% were local and homeless, and 45% were from Honduras/El Salvador. Essentially, most of the patients were from Northern South America. There were a total of three volunteer nurses during their time at the clinic and the three nurses, on average, treated 65 patients per day. The most consistent treatments were for pregnancy, infections, wounds, UTIs, malnutrition, Alopecia due to malnutrition, parasites, and hormonal therapy for transitioning.

While Jim was treating patients, Stacey performed clerical duties for the RHA. She helped the organization move their pen to paper documentation procedures into an electronic format. Stacey is hoping that on their next mission she will have more face time supporting people. Next time, Stacey would like to volunteer at a summer camp in South America that has a proficiency in Spanish requirement. Stacey will need to start her own Duo Lingo streak soon! #Lifelong Learners.




High School Algebra Students Use Transformations to Create Pinwheels

Mrs. McKay's and Mrs. Warren's Algebra class created pinwheels using the computer program Desmos and Transformations.

The students learned about transformations in one of the modules. The main focus was algebraic parent functions that have particular shapes. The students learned how to apply a set of transformations by adding, subtracting, or multiplying these functions to move them around a graph.

They applied the knowledge they learned about transformations and created a design. Each student picked two or three parent functions and transformed them into a design on their pinwheel. They printed their graphs and colored them, then bent them into pinwheels with tacks and pencils. The students had so much fun being creative and seeing their transformation designs come to life.
