# PROFILE

### note about the 2020-2021 school year

The Howard School offered in-person, on-campus learning for all students throughout the 2020-2021 school year. The High School followed a 5-day rotating block schedule during this time. All sports and most clubs and co-curriculars were canceled for the year. The High School has returned to its normal schedule for the 2021-2022 school year, and some sports, clubs, and co-curriculars are being offered.

### curriculum

High School students study a college preparatory curriculum that enables them to learn confidently and become self-advocates for their own learning. Classes are small and students have the opportunity to ask many questions and use strategies such as assistive technology. Our school year is divided into two semesters, each 18 weeks long, separated by a mini-mester in early January where students explore a variety of elective courses. Due to a small high school student population of approximately 125 students, Advanced Placement (AP) and honors classes are not offered, although occasionally high-performing students will take an online AP course. Mathematics is offered through Calculus. Sciences include Physical Science, Biology, Environmental Science and either Chemistry or Earth/Space Science. Students may take either Spanish or American Sign Language. Elective offerings include Robotics, Drama, Film Studies, Yearbook and Journalism, Writing Lab, Math Lab, Music, Art, and the Senior Capstone Project.

### grading

Howard reports GPA on a standard 4.0 scale but neither ranks students nor weights courses. Approximately 60 percent of Howard graduates over the past three years have received the HOPE Scholarship, Georgia's merit based scholarship for students who achieve a 3.0 GPA and take at least four courses of rigor.

since its founding in 1950, Howard has educated students ages five through 12th grade who have diagnosed language-based disabilities or learning differences, such as dyslexia or attention deficit disorder.

A total of 23 Carnegie units must be accrued prior to graduation as follows:

1 credit Health/Physical Education
4 credits Mathematics

2 credits Foreign Language(of the same language)3 credits Social Studies(Including Government and Economics)

5 credits Electives 4 credits Sciences

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### co-curricular activities

Students are encouraged to participate in athletics, honor council, a literary magazine, student government, and student-initiated clubs. Varsity athletics include cross-country, soccer, basketball, swimming, volleyball, track & field, golf, and baseball. Club offerings differ each year depending on student interest and initiative but often include Debate, STEAM Projects, Chess Club, Community Service, Court Sports, and Documentary Film Studies.

### senior capstone project

The Senior Capstone Project (1/2 credit) is a year-long, largely self-directed course for seniors that culminates in a two-week spring internship, and equips students with specific skills related to communicating professionally, as well as understanding and advocating for their unique learning profile and recommended accommodations.

informs the school's curricula and pedagogy. Student-led conferences, goal setting, and e-portfolios support the teaching of cognitive function, particularly how executive functioning impacts learning, leading students to understand who they are as learners and to develop the strategies to advocate for who they are and what they need.

#### **COLLEGE ATTENDANCE AND ACT RANGES**

For the 2016-2021 graduating classes, more than 89% have attended college or technical school. The list of institutions where our graduates have been accepted and attended is below. Howard began offering the ACT in the fall of 2014 and none of the current seniors have taken the SAT. For 2019 through 2021 graduates, about 50 students have taken the ACT. Their best composite scores range from 12 to 33 with the English subsection ranging from 10 to 35 and the Math subsection ranging from 13 to 29.
