2024-2025 SPS Nonresident Student Transfer Guideline Summary

Transfer Request forms may be submitted to the requested school or Springfield School District Office at 640 'A' Street, Springfield by personal delivery, regular mail, email or fax.

Inter-District Transfer windows are open to incoming K-11 nonresident students wishing to attend a Springfield school.

The following schools are available for students requesting an Inter-District (nonresident) transfer into the Springfield School District. Acceptance availability is based on class size.

Note: Those wishing to apply for a Dual Immersion Program must complete a Dual Immersion Application in lieu of an Inter-District Transfer form.

Nonresident Student Definition:

A nonresident student is any student whose parent(s)/legal guardian(s) reside outside Springfield School District attendance boundaries. **As per state law, students may not use addresses of family, friends, businesses or daycare to gain access into a school.** Residing temporarily in a school boundary to access a school does not establish residency.

Lottery Priorities:

Transfer requests are placed on the waiting list by lottery draw determination. The lottery priorities are: 1) returning 12th graders to current school*; 2) returning students to current school*; 3) returning student to the District (new school), 4) sibling of 2024-2025 SPS student at the requested school; 5) sibling of 2024-2025 SPS student within the District; 6) new applicants

*Students enrolled via a current year only inter-district transfers for the 2023-2024 school year may only return to their current school if they submit a 2024-2025 Inter-District Transfer application and there is no wait list of Springfield resident students for that school/grade and an approval has been secured.

Determination/Notification:

Per Oregon law 339.133(5)(a), all nonresident transfers must be released from the resident district before enrolling in a nonresident district. Resident districts are required to provide a written reason for denying a student's release to a nonresident district. Once admission is accepted, Springfield School District will submit the application to the student's resident district for release approval/denial. The requested district determines the length of the transfer. Once a determination has been made, the student's family will receive written notification of the approval or denial.

Deadlines:

High Priority Requests for the coming year are accepted beginning January 4 until 5 p.m. on January 25. Phase 2 Requests are accepted beginning February 1 to June 25 for the coming school year. Phase 3 Requests are accepted beginning July 1 for the coming year. Any new request submitted during Phase 3 window, will process after Fall registration and must be processed after HP and Phase 2 requests. Wait lists are reviewed after each phase. Requests submitted after the first week of September will not be processed until the grading period.

Special Notes:

- Phase 3 new student transfer requests will not process until **after** Fall registration.
- Students must reapply if attending currently via school year only approved transfer, when changing from elementary to middle or from middle to high school or within 10 days if they move from the resident school's attendance area of the approved transfer.
- Students approved through any nonresident transfer are required to attend as full-time students.
- **A transfer will not be considered to participate in athletic activities.**
- Students may not register for school or sign up for or practice with athletic teams or other activity groups at the requested school until the transfer is approved and eligibility is determined.**
- Families providing false information to access a school shall be immediately withdrawn and may be charged tuition.**
- A transfer may be revoked should the student's attendance fall below 90% and/or should the student's behavior fail to meet standards. Student's receiving a transfer revocation are not eligible to apply to transfer for one year.
- The parent/legal guardian** must provide transportation for approved transfer students to and from school, regardless of documented disability.
