Parent and Family Engagement In Policy Development

The Educational Improvement Committee at Frank Seale Middle School is a collaborative group consisting of parents, community members, educators, and the school principal. This committee is dedicated to deliberating on the development and execution of the Parent Engagement Policy for Frank Seale Middle School.

The committee's selection process ensures the representation of a broad spectrum of parents, encompassing all student demographics within the district. Special attention will be given to including Hispanic parents, and arrangements will be made to provide translators to facilitate effective communication within the committee.

Annual Meeting for Title I Parents/Caregivers

Frank Seale Middle School is committed to ensuring that all parents of participating children are well-informed and actively engaged in their child's education. To achieve this, the school holds an annual meeting at a convenient time, to which all parents are invited and encouraged to attend. This meeting serves as an opportunity to inform parents about the school's participation under Title 1 and to explain the requirements and rights associated with this program. The Annual Title 1 meeting is scheduled at the beginning of the school year, with a second annual meeting held in October, which is also offered via Zoom to accommodate diverse schedules and preferences.

We employ various communication methods, including email, Remind, Family Newsletter, and Social Media, to notify parents of these meetings. The principal takes the lead in conducting the meetings, using a district-prepared slide deck as needed to provide comprehensive information. In recognition of our diverse community, translators are made available to assist non-English-speaking parents and caregivers, ensuring that every family has the opportunity to be actively involved in their child's education.

Title III Parent, Family & Community Engagement

At Frank Seale Middle School we will utilize Title I funds to offer tailored services that address the unique requirements of our emerging bilingual and English learner students. In line with our commitment to fostering strong connections between school, home, and the community, Franke Seale Middle School is dedicated to organizing a minimum of one parent, family, and community engagement event every school year. These engagement activities are designed specifically to cater to the needs of the parents, families, and wider community of our emergent bilingual students.

We understand the importance of accessibility, which is why these events are scheduled at times and locations that are convenient for all involved. Notices for these gatherings will be disseminated through written invitations to parents/caregivers, as well as through public notices to ensure wide-reaching participation. Additionally, we will have translators available to assist non-English-speaking parents and caregivers, making these engagements accessible and inclusive to all members of our community.

Parent-Student Compacts

In compliance with Title I regulations, Frank Seale Middle School will create and annually update a parent-student agreement. This agreement serves as a blueprint for fostering shared responsibility between the school and parents/caregivers to enhance student performance and success. It delineates how students, parents/caregivers, and staff will collaborate in supporting student achievement.

The agreements are designed to accommodate signatures from both the student and their parents or guardians. We strongly encourage students and parents to engage in a conversation about the contents of the agreement. Additionally, we invite them to sign the agreement to signify their commitment and understanding and, if they wish, to return the signed agreement to the school. Please note that returning the agreements to the school is optional; it is not a mandatory requirement for parents and/or students.
