## 13. STAFF REPORT AND BOARD DISCUSSION

Anacapa Adult Transition Update

The Anacapa Adult Transition Program is designed to support individuals transitioning from school to adulthood, providing services and resources for post-secondary education, employment, and independent living. Faculty and staff assist students on developing social skills, vocational training and community integration for adult life.

Trustees expressed their extreme heartfelt gratitude, pride for the students, staff, teachers and parents at Anacapa and praise for all the work they have done as it's felt during visits and graduation ceremonies that Trustees and staff have attended.

Transition Partnership Program – Career Support for Special Education Students

Transition Partnership Programs (TPP) were developed in response to the 1986 Amendments to the Rehabilitation Act and the 1983 Amendments to the Education for the Handicapped Act. The OUHSD TPP program connects high school students with disabilities to the California Department of Rehabilitation (DOR) and assists with their transition to work. This program is designed to help students overcome barriers to employment.

Dr. McCoy noted that Mr. Adams can start the conversation with Directors Garcia and Phillippe about offering students credit for the units in this class as research within Work Experience would need to be done.

Trustee Sher called for a break at 8:52pm. The meeting resumed at 9:06pm

The OUHSD Board of Trustees is considering granting easements and rights-of-way to the City of Oxnard to provide necessary public utilities, streets and facilities to DSHS. The easements and rights-of-way, to be conveyed to the City will allow the City to survey, install, construct, reconstruct, enlarge, lay, alter, operate, inspect, remove, relocate, replace and maintain the water pipeline facilities and storm drain facilities. This public hearing allows for Trustees to consider the easement as stated in Resolution 23-45 that was adopted at the October 25, 2023 Board meeting.

President Sher opened the public hearing at 9:07pm. There being no comments, written comments or protests for the Conveyance of Easements to the City of Oxnard for the Purposes of Providing Necessary Public Utilities, Streets, and Facilities to DSHS, President Sher declared the Public Hearing closed at 9:09pm.

**Approved**

It is the recommendation of District Administration that the Board of Trustees approve the request to increase substitute teacher hourly rates, as presented.

- Substitute teachers typically work five, if prep period is taken, to six hours per day and they are paid hourly.
- Dr. Salgado affirmed teachers are paid more than substitute teachers as there are more responsibilities involved that don't exist in a substitute teacher's assignment.
- Substitute teachers received an incentive pay during COVID; therefore, raises for them weren't brought forward for Trustees to consider and they aren't part of the collective bargaining agreement.
- Trustees reiterated that substitute teacher's compensation terms need to be clear and consistent with the language used, especially noting bonuses aren't long term and aren't written into the district's funding.
- Trustees agreed to review the substitute teacher pay annually in May or June, before the adopted budget is brought for consideration.

Motion: Trustee Hall moved to maintain the existing pay structure for substitutes, including the bonus, until Friday, November 17, 2023 and approve this pay structure, as presented, effective Monday, November 27, 2023 and that this item would be brought back, in May or June, for review again. Seconded by Trustee Flores-Haro and carried unanimously by a vote of 5:0.


