




Children will begin to understand the importance of practice.

And it's all based on practice.




All parents want their children to be confident.

The Kumon Method empowers children to become self-learners. Each time our students tackle and overcome a new challenge, their confidence grows, and they realize they are achieving more than they thought they could. Kumon puts them on the path to becoming the confident, independent, self-reliant people all parents want their children to be.

Kumon encourages independent learning.

At a Kumon Center, you'll find no blackboards or lectures. Instead of passively receiving instruction from teachers or tutors, Kumon Students actively develop self-learning skills. Here's how:

- Each student progresses at their own pace through an individualized lesson plan established by their instructor.
- Students do daily assignments that take about 30 minutes per subject.
- Students work under the supervision of Kumon Center staff twice per week - in person or virtually - and independently the other days.
- Each worksheet teaches a lesson that's one small step more advanced than the lesson before, so students progress smoothly and gain confidence with each new success.

The Kumon Placement Test assesses your child's strengths and needs.

Everyone needs a starting point. The first step in your child's journey is one of the most important steps of all.

- With the Kumon Instructor observing, your child takes a placement test to gauge their abilities in math and reading.
- Along with your child's test score, the Kumon Instructor takes note of your child's concentration level, speed, handwriting and more.
- The instructor assesses the information to determine the best starting point for your child, and then designs an individual program around your child's abilities, needs and goals.


Kids are set up for success from the start.

- Soon, usually within the first few weeks, you'll see your child develop better study habits, improved concentration and a more positive attitude toward learning.





Kumon helps children create strong study habits.

- Starting your child at the level that best suits their abilities ensures an understanding of the basic concepts before moving on to more advanced ones.
- If your child can breeze through the early worksheets, that's very good news. It indicates your child is starting at a level where there are no gaps in their knowledge. It also allows your child to build strong study habits.



This example of a math placement score shows the student should start at Level 2A1.






The Kumon worksheets are the key to the Kumon Method and to your child's success.




- Worksheets are designed so students can solve the problems on their own. Many worksheets also include examples to follow.

Levels 3A-B Addition, subtraction.












Virtual Learning

The virtual classes are being held via videoconferencing where students complete the assigned work from the comfort of their home while a certified Instructor or assistant is available for assistance.









The Kumon Instructor is a qualified, dedicated partner for you and your child.

Completely dedicated to helping children succeed, your child's Kumon Instructor is there to guide, assess and encourage your child. The instructor will also communicate with you everything from the lesson plans to progress reports, small breakthroughs and big successes.

Your child's instructor designs a lesson plan with assigned worksheets that progress at a pace that works best for your child.




As your child works through the worksheets, the instructor offers guidance as needed.

Encourage your child to complete daily assignments just as they would practice a sport or musical instrument. 3.


Celebrate small and large wins and look for opportunities to praise your child.

frequently asked questions

My child is already a good student. Why should I enroll him or her in Kumon?

Advanced students are introduced to new concepts earlier than at school, giving them the advantage of learning new material ahead of their peers. In fact, many Kumon Students study above grade level, and this opens new educational opportunities throughout their school years and into higher education.

My child is a bit behind. How long will it take to catch up?

Kumon's individualized instruction differs from one-on-one tutoring services that provide "quick fix" short-term boosts in performance. If your child is a bit behind fellow classmates, our short-term goal is to reach grade-level competency within 12 months. Some students take a little longer, but many accomplish it sooner.

Why keep my child in Kumon year after year?

What sets Kumon apart from other learning programs and tutors is the impact our progressive method makes on your child's success over time. With ongoing individualized instruction, Kumon Students develop confidence and independence – key traits for success at any age.

How will the instructor know what material is right for my child?

The instructor takes many factors into account when creating your child's lesson plan. The first step is establishing the starting point based on your child's placement test results and study behavior. From there, the instructor designs a lesson plan with assigned worksheets that

advance at a pace that works best for your child. The instructor reviews each class and homework assignment, looks at the time and score, and observes how the problems were solved to improve and fine-tune the lesson plan.

Will my child's assignments cover the same material school does?

The Kumon Program covers many of the concepts taught in school but is meant to supplement the school curriculum — not replace it. Our program is designed from the top down and progresses in small steps to build all of the critical skills needed to study high school-level calculus and high school-level literary texts.

Will someone sit with my child at the center?

The Kumon Worksheets are designed to guide students to figure out new concepts on their own by following examples and developing their self-learning ability from the start. The instructor is there to instruct and support your child, but the aim is for your child to be able to solve problems with confidence. If your child is in the earliest Kumon Levels, from 6A to 5A in Math, or 7A to 3A in Reading, the instructor and assistants will provide necessary guidance in the center.

What if my child is stuck on a problem at home? Should I help?

If your child is stuck on a concept, let your instructor know. The instructor can tell you the right way to guide your child and adjust your child's lesson plan if needed. The best support you can give is to encourage your child to complete the daily assessments and praise them for doing the work.
