#### LEARN SOMETHING NEW ABOUT HERITAGE

**Saint Nicholas Day** is celebrated yearly on December 6 in many European countries, usually by filling stockings and shoes that children leave out overnight.

**Bodhi Day** is a Buddhist holiday celebrated on December 8th. It is most commonly celebrated by East Asia's Buddhist Mahayana traditions found in Japan, Korea, and Vietnam. During this holiday, many people perform acts of kindness and generosity.

**Hanukkah** is a Jewish holiday celebrated in the winter, usually in December. It celebrates the victory of the Maccabees over the larger Greek army. It is celebrated for eight days, and is one of the most popular Jewish religious observances. This year Hanukkah is December 7-15.

Yule falls on the winter solstice, which occurs yearly on December 21 or 22. With roots in the Roman celebration of Saturnalia, Yule marks the start of winter. The holiday was eventually extended to span 12 days between the winter solstice and the new year.

**Kwanzaa** is celebrated December 26-January 1st. During the holiday, families and communities eat together, honor their ancestors, and celebrate African and African American culture. Each day celebrants light a candle that represents one of 7 principles: unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity, and faith.
