HOW TO KEEP KIDS LEARNING DURING WINTER BREAK

The winter holiday break is a fun-filled time for you and your family to unwind and spend quality time together, but it will be over before you know it! Children's school success begins at home, and even the simplest steps can mean a big difference for your child's future. To keep your child's skills sharp and ensure a smooth transition to going back to school, Scholastic offers tips to keep kids learning:

- Read for pleasure. Whether your child is in the mood for holiday
 favorites like *The Night Before Christmas* or their favorite series,

Look at the Reading Reels video with your parents. Practice the sounds from the video.




How Much Time Do Students Spend on Their Learning Paths?

How to help kids from getting sick!

Teach children good **hand washing** habits and make sure they are washing their hands often. Make hand sanitizer available and use it when you are on the go.

Five simple and effective steps for good handwashing:

- -Wet your hands with clean water.
- -Lather palms, fingers, nails and backs of your hands with soap.
- -Scrub for at least 20 seconds.
- -Rinse your hands with clean water.
- -Dry your hands thoroughly with a clean paper towel.
