


# The Journey of a Lifetime








#### Prom '96


## The Crowns of Enchantment



The evening ended with a feeling of happiness.








Along with each goal in life for improvement, and slowly but surely the idea of a computer lab with fast computers and the highest levels of technology did not seem so far away.







Other than having conflicts with the students and keeping everything organized, the new faculty seemed to enjoy their first year at Forest Lake Senior TEACHER




## Forest Breeze






Of the students asked, the majority said they liked it here and would come back for a vacation, possibly even to attend college.

him. With his help, Audrey realized her boyfriend Orin, was no good for her. Due to Audrey II's need for food, Seymour fed Orin to it.


One day the plant started to talk to Audrey and bribed her into coming closer to look inside at all the others it had already eaten. She did and found herself to be the plants next meal.







"Our season was great, we had upbeat players with great attitudes," said Coach Jim Herman.







Next season the team will be gaining back a lot of top runners and hope to do very well at their region meet and make it to the state meet.










# Rangers on Ice



There are many things the guys can do to stay prepared even during the off season, such as; attend clinics, weight training and practice, practice and more practice.







Carried along by the goals of being Conference and Region champions and with hopes of placing in the top four at the State Competitions, the 1997 Gymnastics team strived for their all around best.


