






One Act Play









A unique advantage in career research is given to those students at FLHS interested in law. The Mock Trial team is made up of students from all three grades, and coached by Ms. Kristen Nellis. 
Art Club



Back Rubs Anyone?



Sophomore Katie Anderson says, "I think it will be tough next year, but hopefully we will be just as good and will also help the new girls hold the positions."








What's up with "Why Not?"



The Girls Swimming and Diving team survived a tougher year than most. With new coaches and leadership, the team came together and helped each other to excel.



days a week" stated Bernklau. Within the past few years the girls have made many wonderful memories.









All this contributed to a memorable night and there was fun to be had by all.


