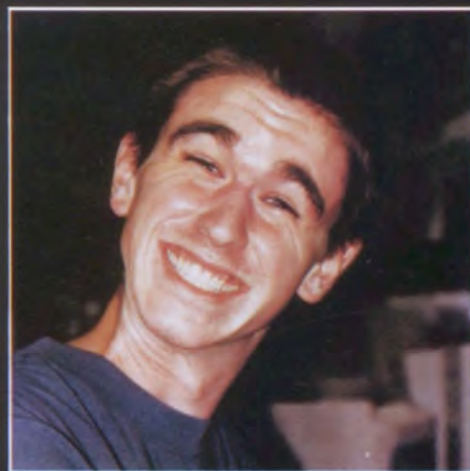

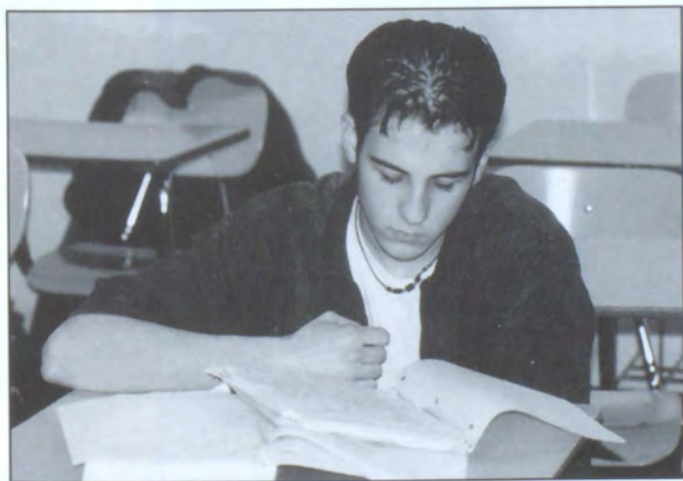

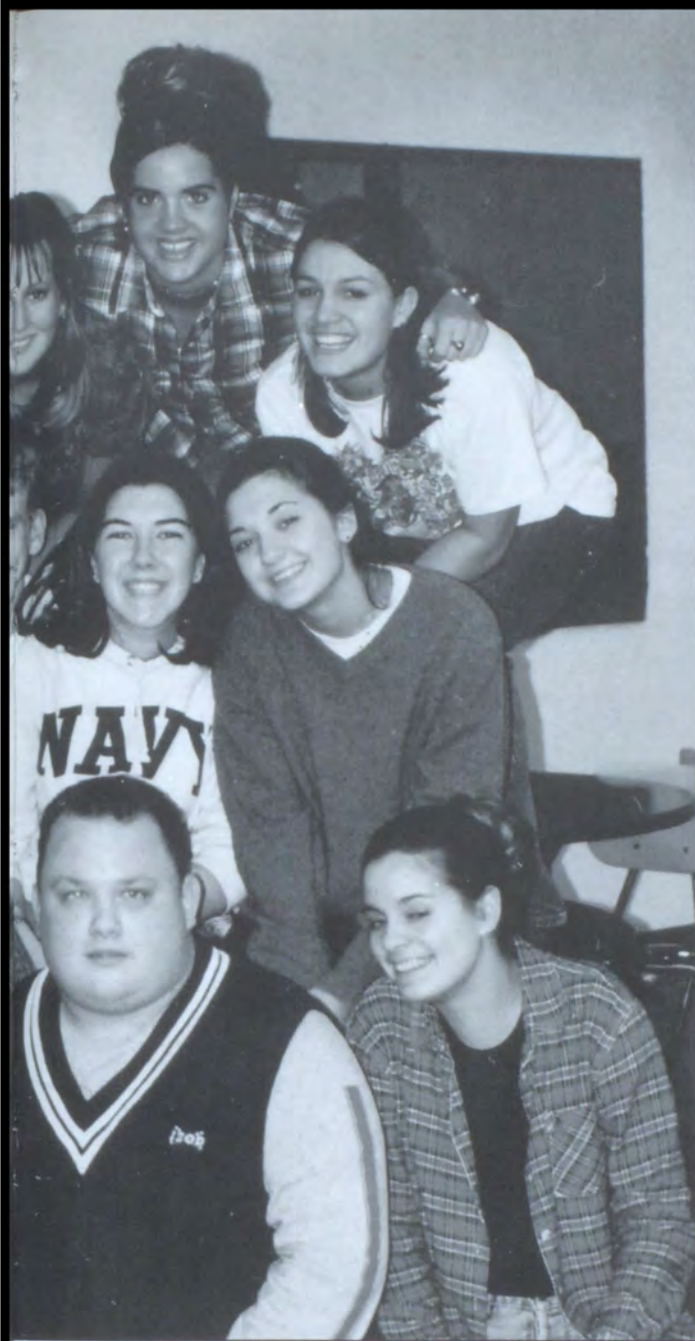

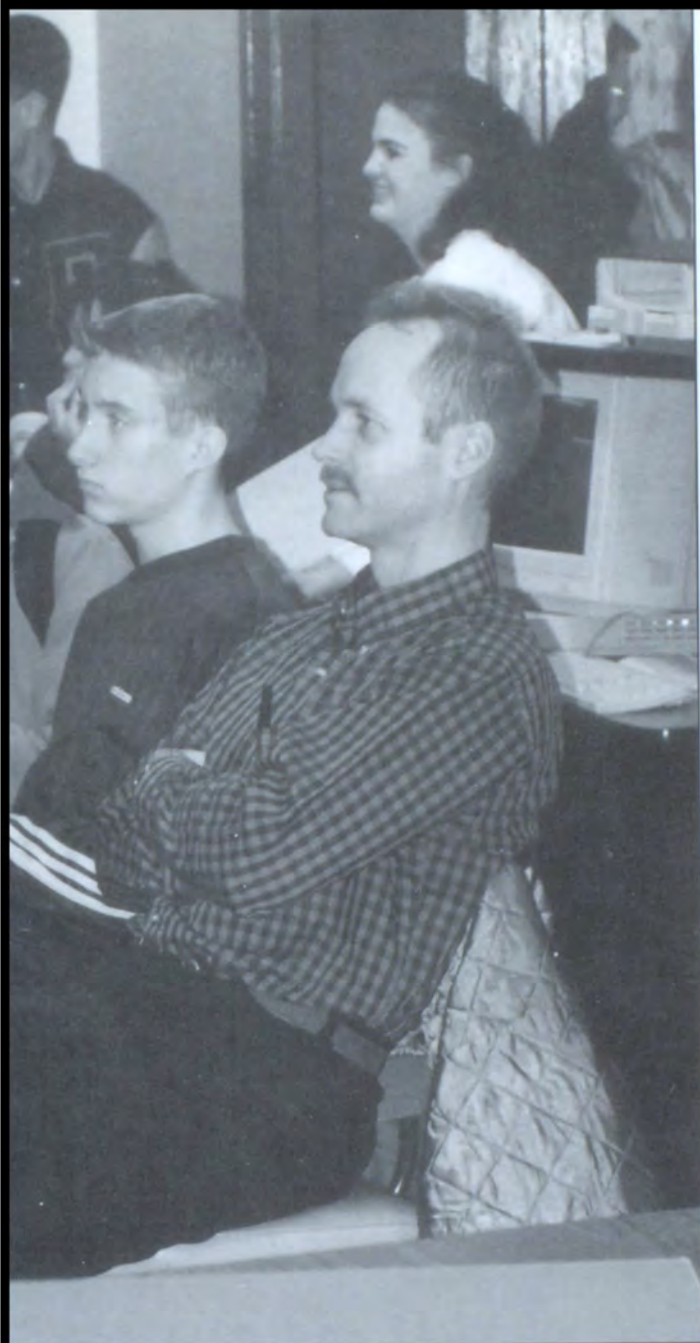

Expanding. Growing. Ideas shooting into and popping in and out of their heads like it was nothing at all. Taking nothing and making it into something worthwhile, worth listening to; then being scored on what they've come up with. If there was a group of people that flourished their horizons in mental capabilities, then the members of Odyssey of the Mind were that.

For those of you who have forgotten what Odyssey of the Mind was: It's an "on your toes" competition. The group has two types of matches. The first is spontaneous, where, for example, the group is given a word and they have to find as many relations to it as possible. Then they are scored on how creative their responses are. Taking a simple word like blue, and in a minute coming up with as many words associated with the word blue as possible. Now, it sounds kind of easy, but test yourself, it's hard! The other is the long-term match. For example, this year, they had to create a play. In this play they had to include ten lines of a Shakespearean play, create a song, a poster, and an advertisement for that play. They practiced four times a week, Monday through Thursday, each preparing themselves to give their long-term presentation. Finally, when they give their performance, they let out weeks of preparation, agonizing work, and the best in intelligence.

As a coach, Cynthia Riesgraf didn't really "coach" per-se, but more just questioned if "that is the correct route to take." The rules did not allow her to give her own ideas to the members, because she was not part of the team. She could help to open their minds to second-guess themselves. In that, they could grow to be more creative and more responsive. Riesgraf said, "I can't go and say, 'Okay, let's do it this way, or let's do it this way,' but I am allowed to ask questions: 'Does that make sense?' 'Will that work the way you want it to?'... and I do... I *think* I help."

"You can do so many different things... you're not restricted. You can have different categories, or like, it's not part of a sport where you have to follow certain rules and you're not allowed to do anything else. It's a stretch of the imagination," said co-captain Elizabeth Wheatley.

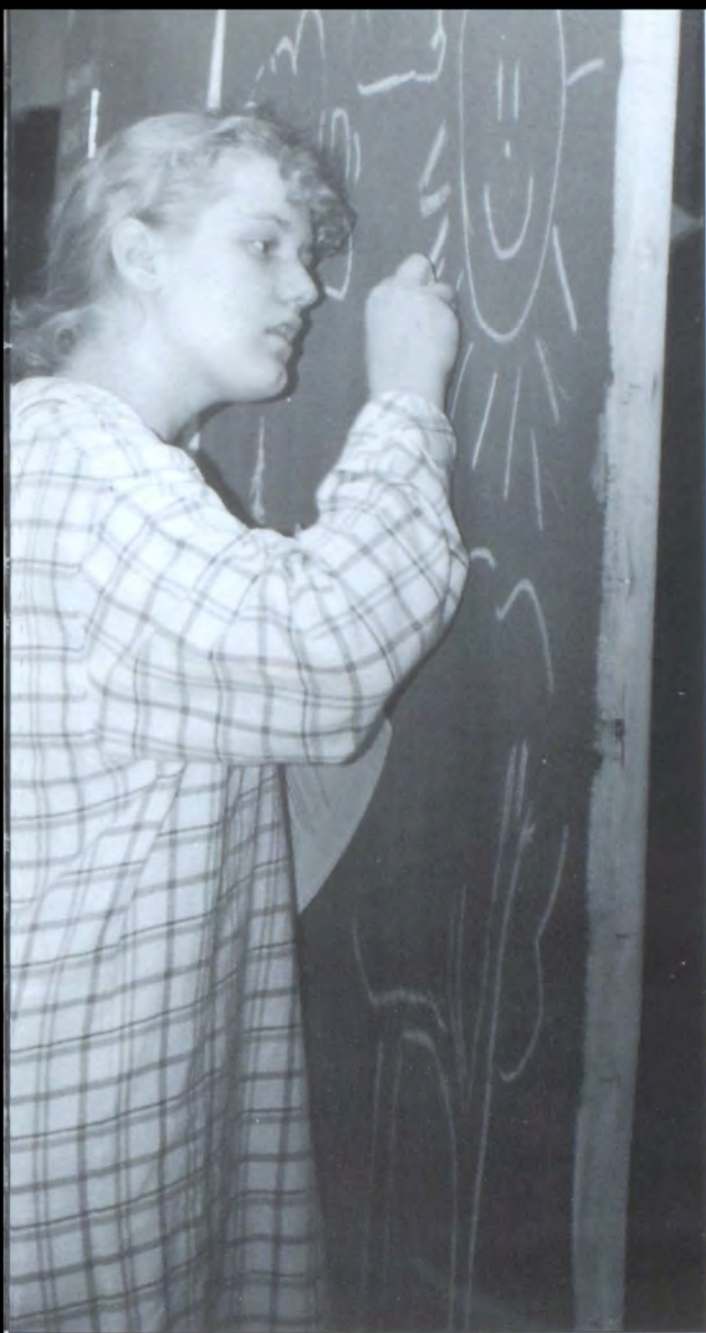

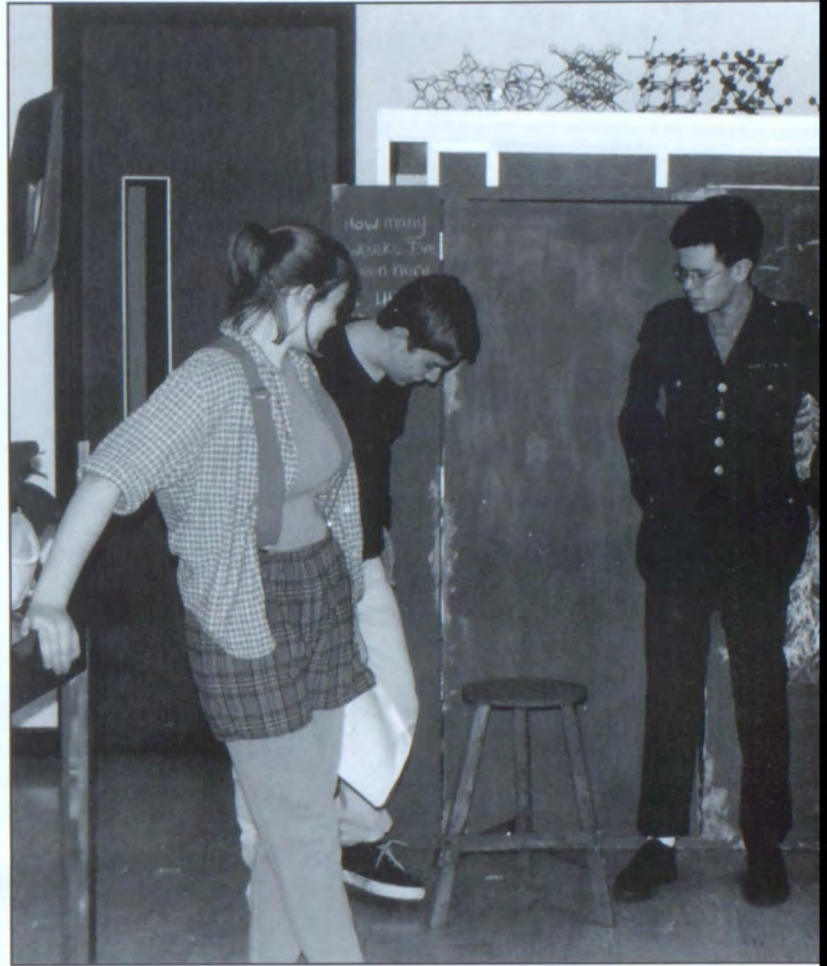

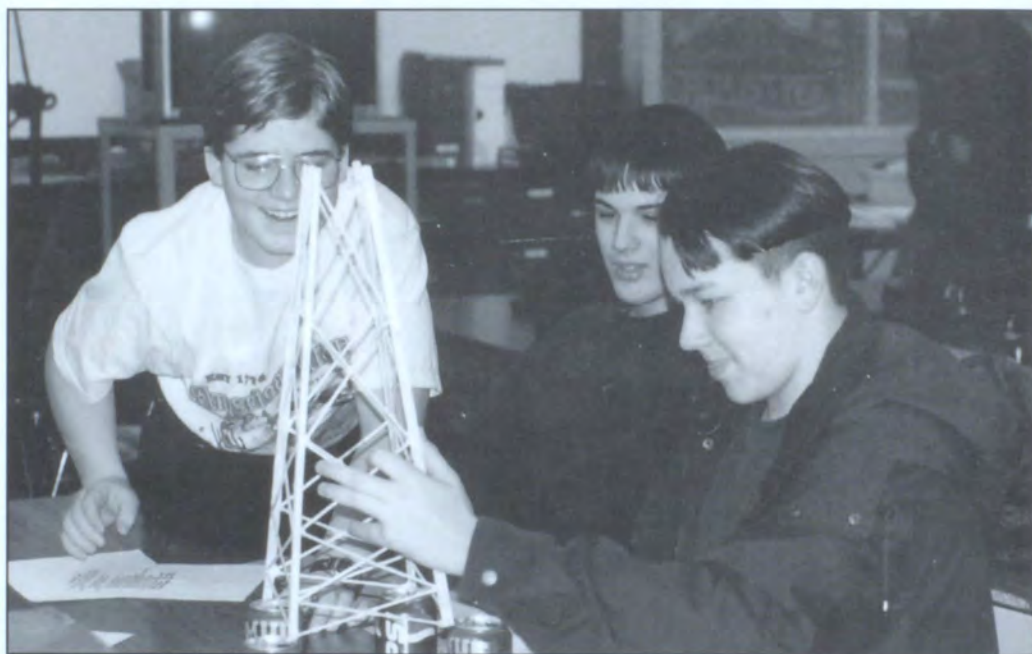

Mock Trial

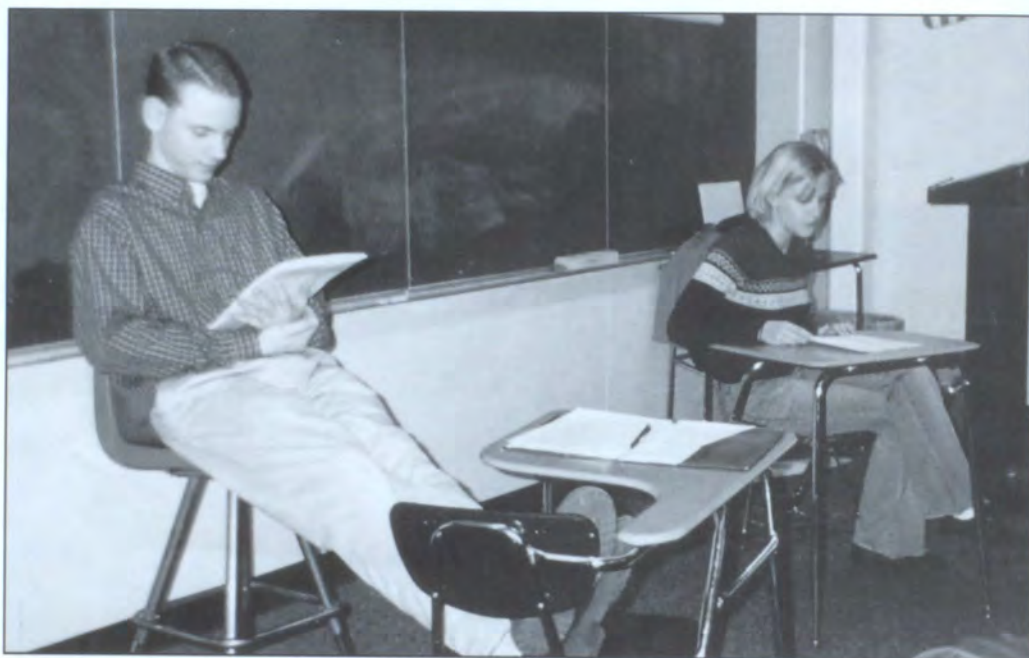
It was very hard to go through a day without having heard a story on the news about a major trial going on somewhere. Lawyers and attorneys argued cases where so much was at stake, sometimes even life itself. The Mock Trial team may not have dealt with such major cases, but certainly realistic situations. A unique case was presented to them, they took on such roles as attorneys and witnesses, and a real court trial was held. Presided over by real lawyers and judges, they presented their cases and were critiqued on their skills, time-management, and how well they presented their position during the trial.

Advising these lawyers-in-training again was Ronald Tungseth. In response to being asked what the most interesting part of Mock Trial was, he said, "It's a unique blend of forensics, team competition, and theater." Tungseth helped start the program in Forest Lake about ten years ago after receiving a flyer from the Minnesota State Bar Association, and consulting a local attorney. Through being involved with the team, he said he became, "...more aware of legal processes," and also, "...gained insights into historical cases."

For the year, the case was a pre-trial hearing for a juvenile suspect in an arson-homicide, to determine if the individual committed the crime and if they should be tried as an adult. Mock Trial members practiced about two to three times per week to prepare notes and iron out arguments before they competed. As attorneys and witnesses, team members became better acquainted with the legal system and possibly even better prepared for a career in law in the future. Remember these faces, they could be representing you later in life!

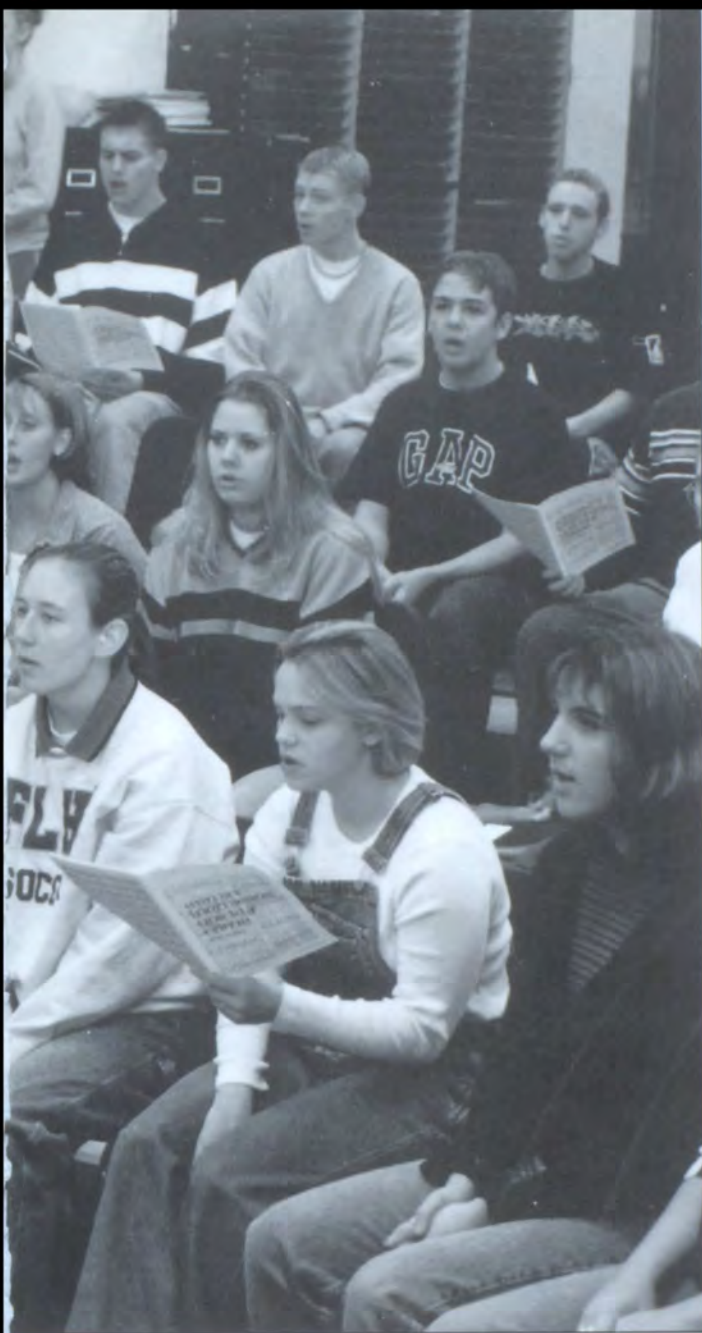

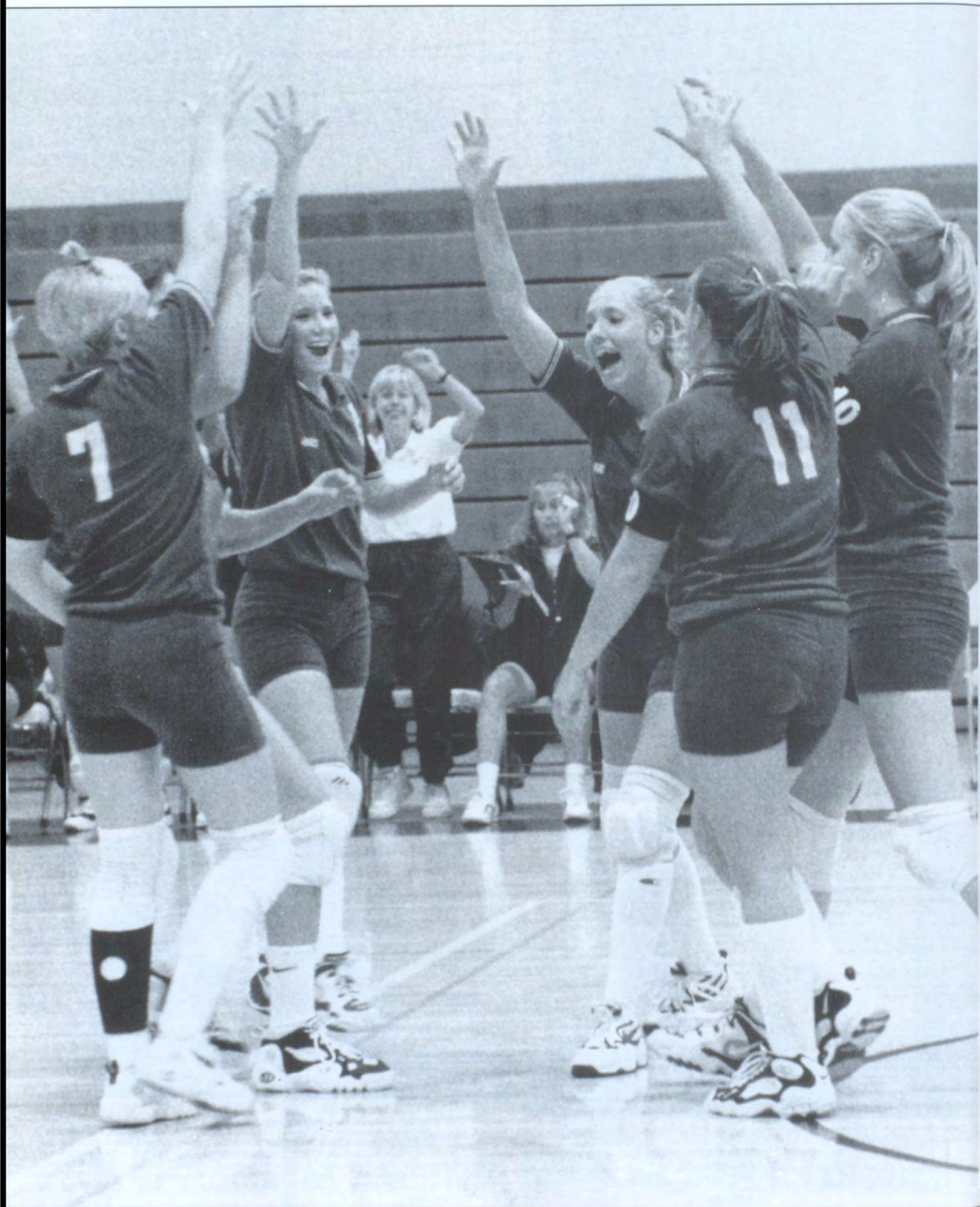

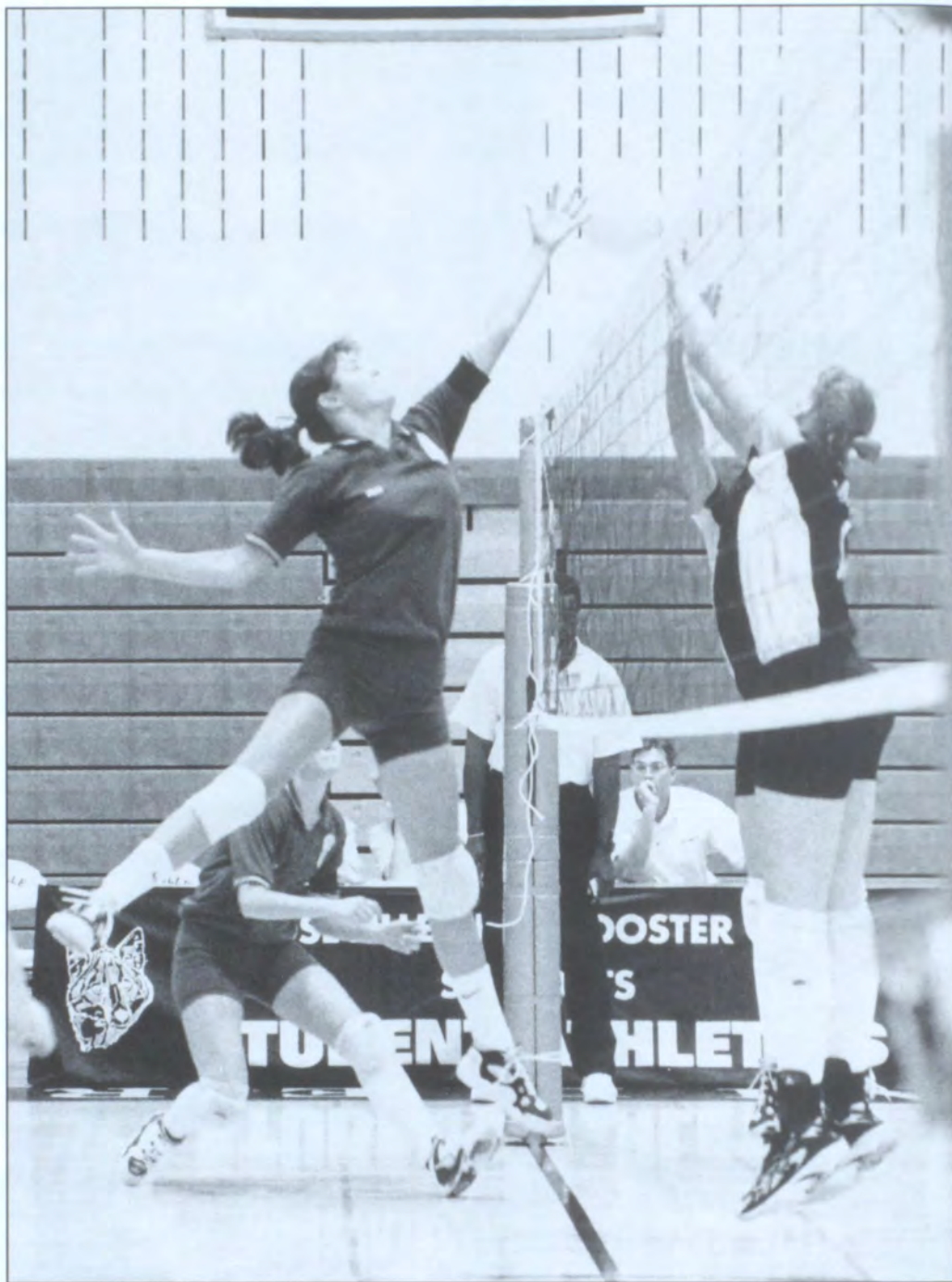

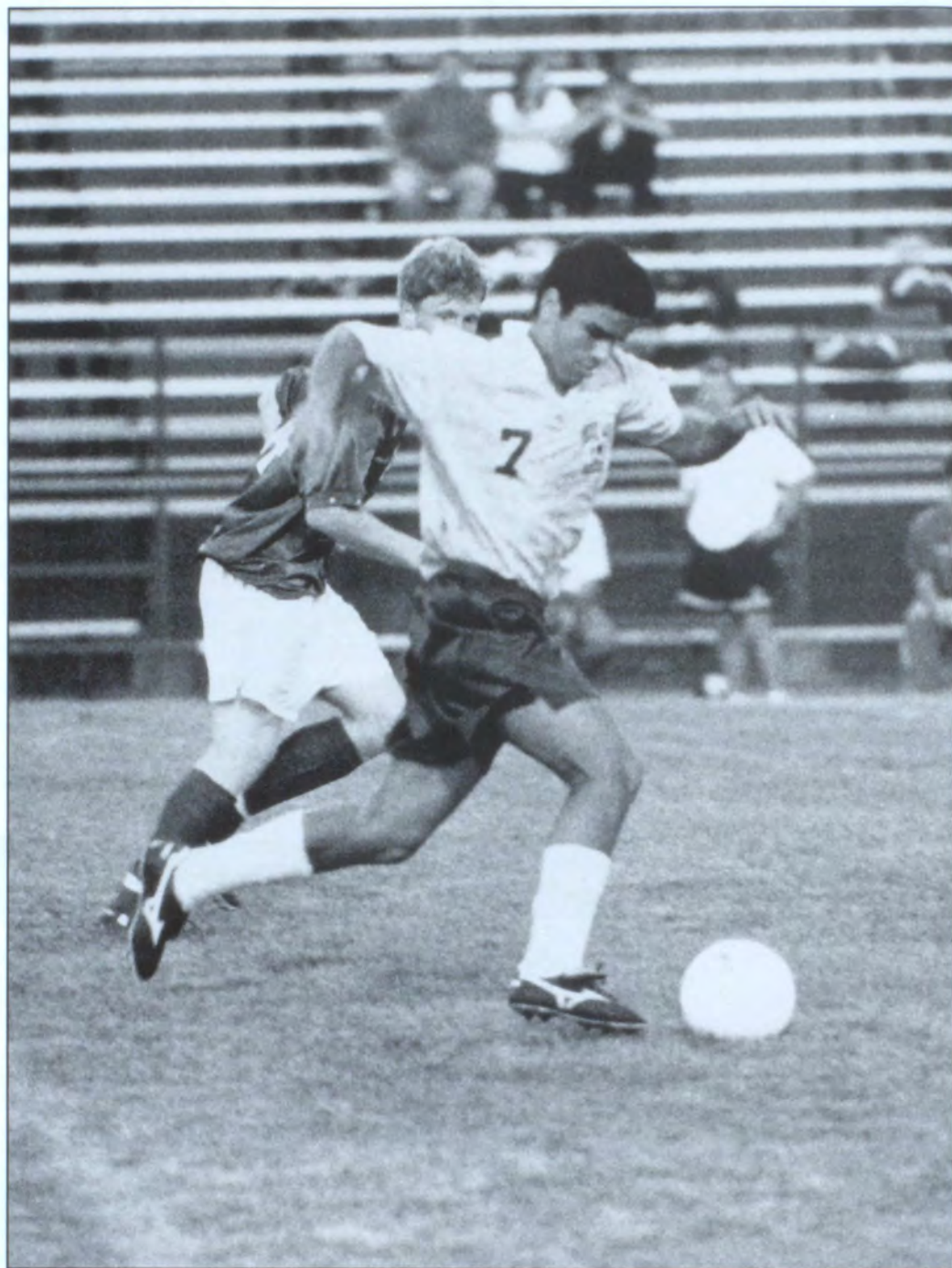

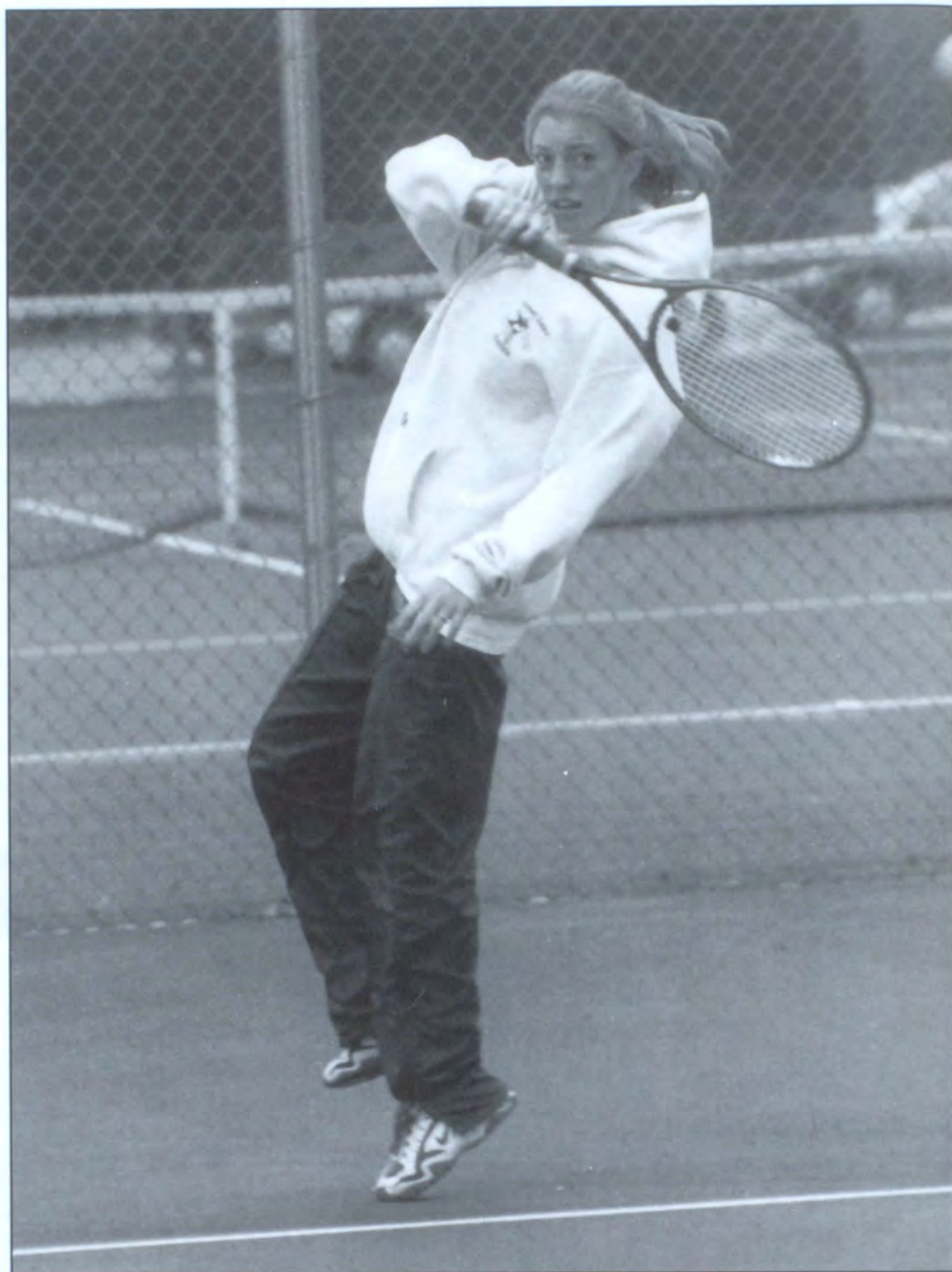

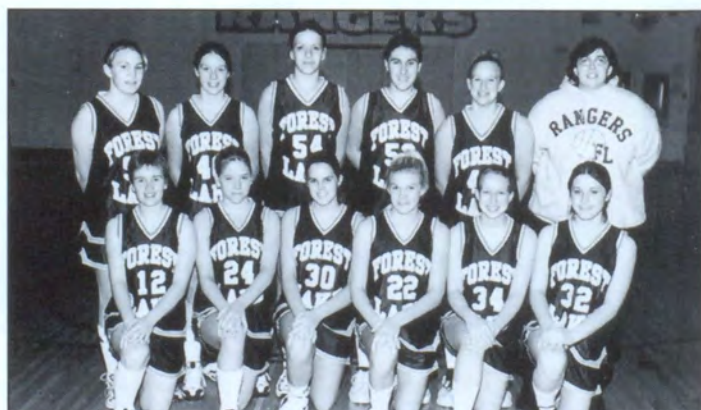
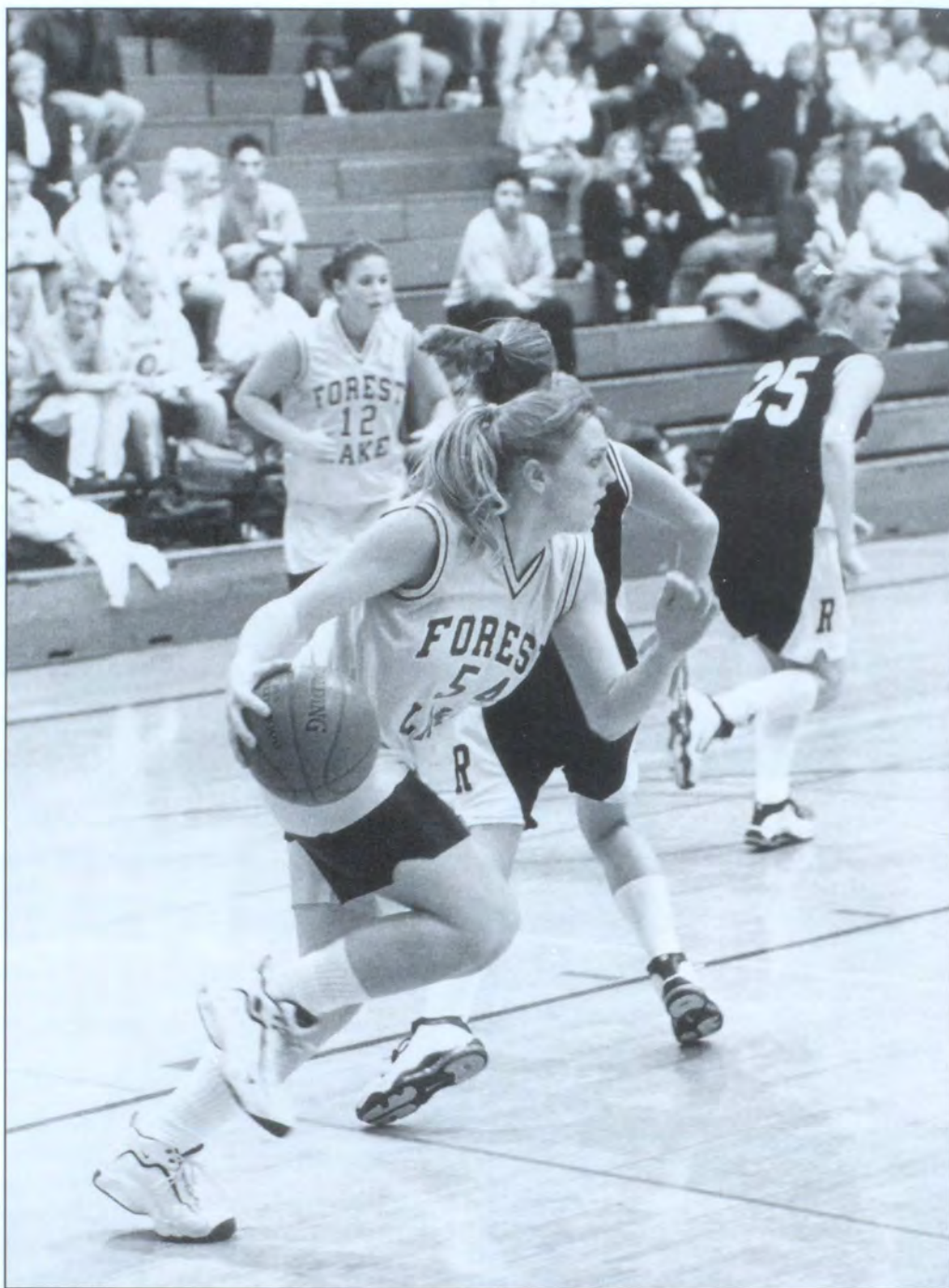

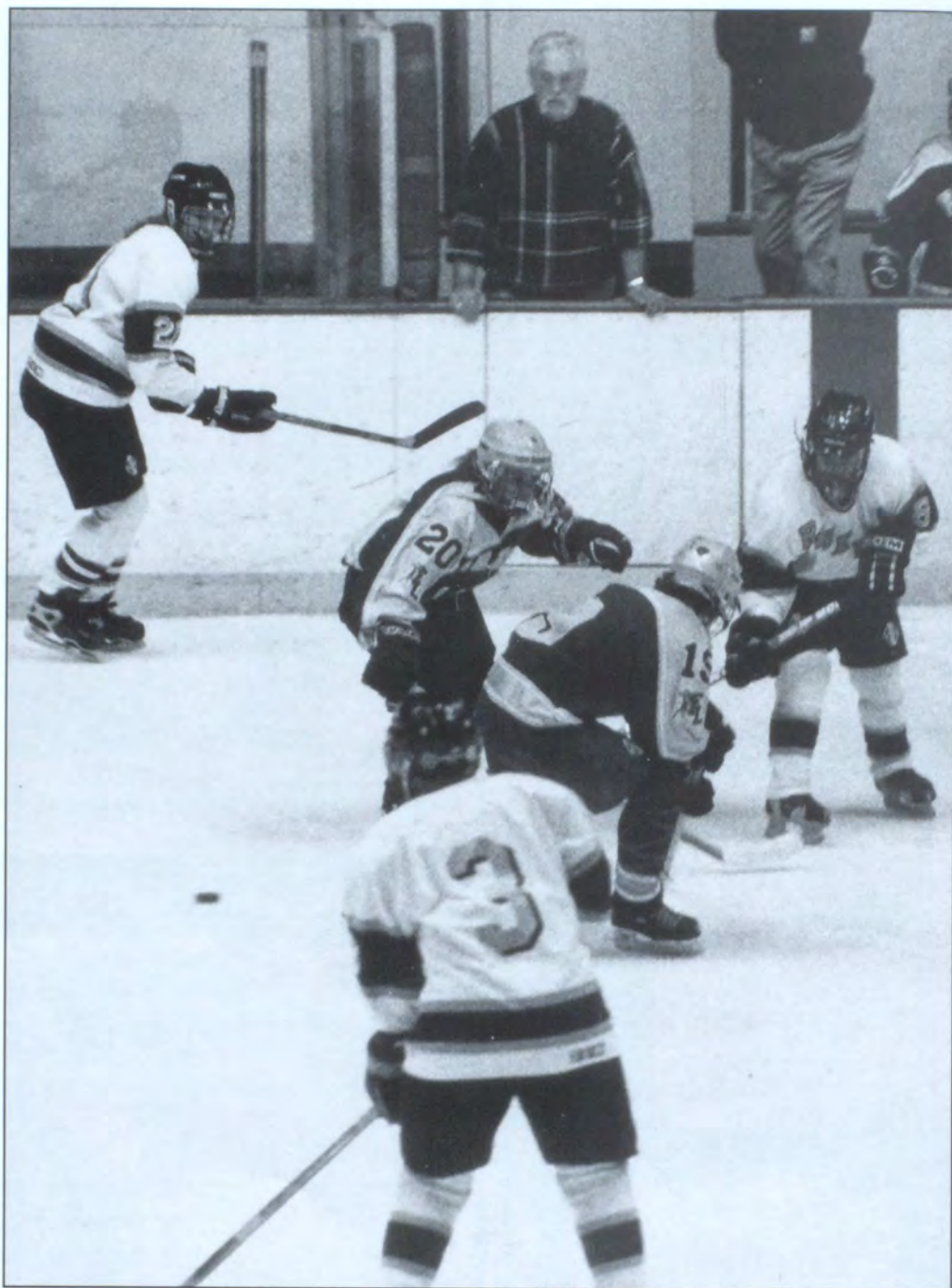

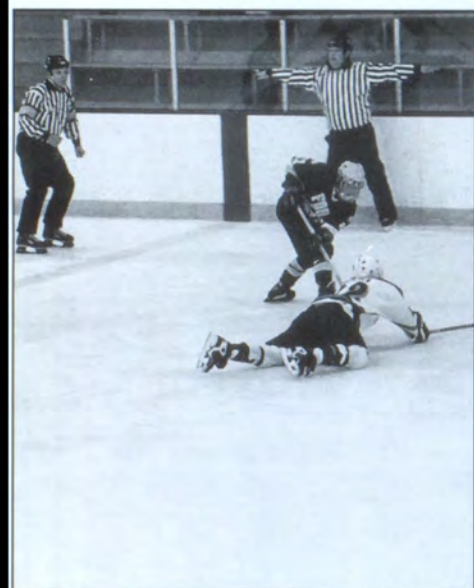

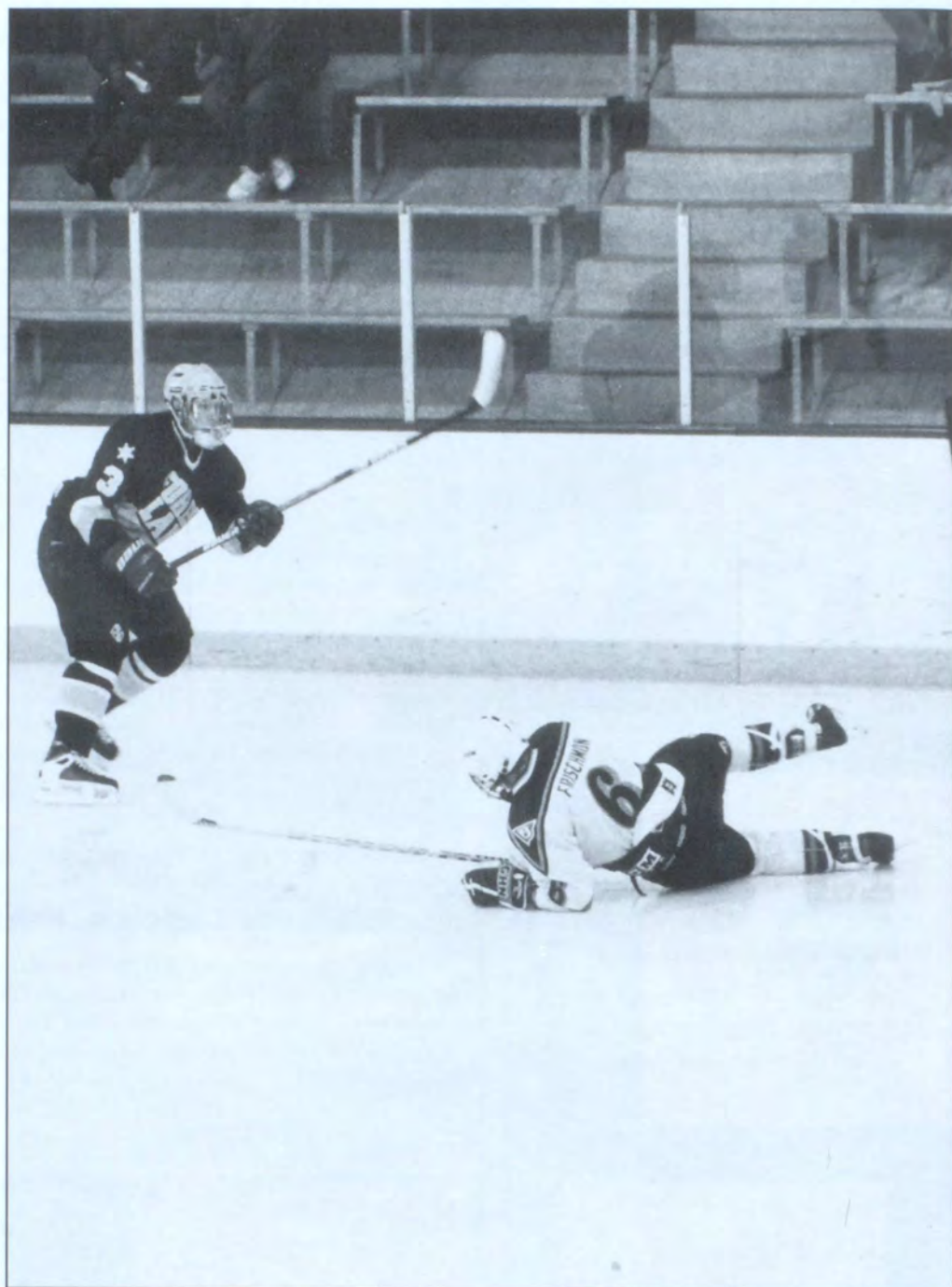

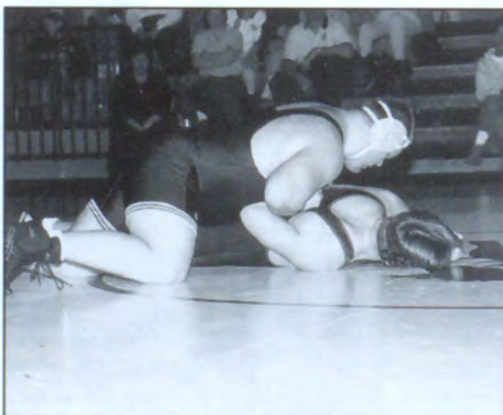

Colophon

A staff of nineteen produced Volume 61 of the Forester. There were 12 seniors, 5 juniors, and 2 sophomores working on the book. Maria Kaiser advised the staff for her second year. She did not have an assistant adviser to help her through the process, and instead relied on Editor-in-Chief Cathleen Hess.

The individuals met four deadlines during the year. At each deadline, an average of 52 pages were completed. The book contained 208 pages with one four page tip-in, as well as a 24 page spring suppliment. All pages were printed on 80 lb. enamel paper, except for the Senior section, which was layed out on 100 lb. enamel paper. The fonts used in the book were: Genesis for all body copy, Genesis Bold Italic for captions, and Malibu Bold Italic for headlines.

The cover was Red 061 with a Cordova grain and a black rub applied. A metalique, gold foil stamp for the "Way to Shine" was used, and the '99 graphic was embossed. The book was sold for \$45.00, and was purchased by both students and community members. The Forester staff sold 1,300 books. The total cost of the book production was \$57,000. Besides book sales, additional money was earned through the purchase of ads from local merchants and Ads for Grads.

Extended thanks to Taylor Publishing in Dallas, Texas and Taylor representative Anne Mueller, David Bank Studio, Picture Place, and Adviser Maria Kaiser. It is evident you are getting better and better at this "yearbook thing" as each year passes! Best of luck to you on the books you advise in the future.

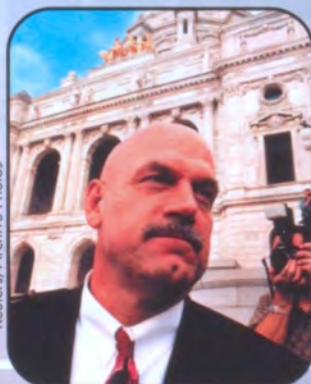

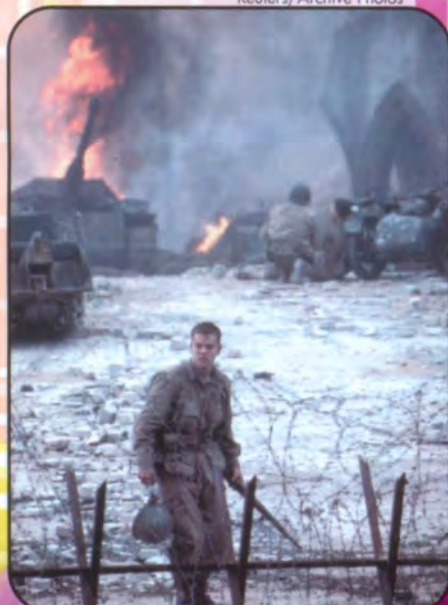
