The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Mrs. Overrocker.

<u>Pledge of Allegiance</u> - The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Budget Discussions - Mr. Wheelock began the budget discussion with a recap of the budget development process. He explained state aid (Foundation, BOCES and Building), Gap Elimination Adjustment (GEA) and the 2% tax levy limit. Information was shared on how the budget was developed and the cuts in spending that were enacted to produce a budget to be presented to the Board for adoption. Mr. Wheelock also shared how much fund balance (\$817,000) was used and how much that leaves us going forward (2.8%). Further discussion emphasized areas and/or programs that were cut or reduced; as well as, positions that were considered for elimination. Laura Nelson spoke on behalf of a group of concerned parents regarding a music position being eliminated. They strongly oppose the elimination of the position and cannot support a budget that does so. They also asked for a long term commitment from the district for the music program. Mr. Wheelock stated he wasn't going to make a long term plan just for music. A long term plan would be for the whole district and would benefit all students. Daniel Buckingham spoke regarding arts in education and the music program. He emphasized the importance that music and cultural things play in attracting families to the area. Mr. Bottini encouraged community members to talk to their legislators and share what effects merely teaching to the mandates can have on districts. Josh Overrocker stated he didn't think the programs were going to go away in the next two years. He emphasized that certain music programs are still in the budget and that a music position is being considered to be eliminated. Jason Powles strongly requested the district look at other areas before cutting music. Parents are upset that the music program is looked at being cut year after year after year. He stated all programs are important and we want well-rounded students. Tammy Purrington said the middle school is at the bare bones, there are a lot of people working hard to cover the losses and we are all feeling the cuts. Mr. Nicotera stated by using the fund balance to close the gap on the 2013-14 budget, we are cutting into next years budget and these same positions will be discussed again next year.

Budget Discussions (Cont'd) - David Overrocker said the Board has a very tough job. We need help from parents and for parents to get involved. Mrs. Overrocker spoke about her family's involvement in both music and sports. She thanked everybody for attending the meeting and encouraged everyone to get involved. Mrs. Frost said the Board has worked out a very sound budget and thanked Mr. Wheelock and Mrs. Stillman for their efforts. Mr. Nicotera commended Melissa Weaver for accepting the Math position at the high school as it saved other peoples jobs and programs.

<u>Public to Be Heard</u> - Mrs. Overrocker asked if anyone wished to address the Board and no one did so.

<u>Students to Be Heard</u> - Mrs. Overrocker asked if any students wished to address the Board and none did so. There were students present.

<u>Superintendent's Report</u> - Announce Board of Education Candidates - Draw for Ballot Order - The results of the draw for ballot order for placement of the candidates names on the ballot were Jim Dever and Kim S. Overrocker.
