The meeting was called to order at 7:08 p.m. by Mrs. Overrocker.

<u>Pledge of Allegiance</u> - The pledge of allegiance was recited.

<u>Public to Be Heard</u> - Mrs. Overrocker asked if anyone wished to address the Board and one person did so. Nancy Waldeck, 4th grade teacher, on behalf of the 4th grade classes, invited the Board to step back in time to the colonial era on Monday, April 27, 2015 at 2:00 p.m. at the elementary school. Students will be demonstrating different trades from that time period.

<u>Students to Be Heard</u> - Mrs. Overrocker asked if any students wished to address the Board and none did so. No students were present.

<u>Board of Education Sub-Committee Reports</u> - Facilities and Transportation - The Facilities and Transportation sub-committee met prior to the Board meeting. The main purpose of the meeting was to discuss the upcoming capital project. Mr. Wheelock reviewed the scope of the project with the Board. Mr. Cowen distributed to the Board a breakdown of different dollar amounts for the project and what the cost would be to the taxpayer for those various scenarios.

<u>Superintendent's Report</u> - School Boards Institute (SBI) Awards Ceremony - Mr. Wheelock reminded the Board of the ceremony on Thursday, May 14, 2015 at 5:15 p.m. (check-in) with dinner and program at 6:00 p.m. at the Radisson. Lauren Leitz, student, will be receiving SBI's 2015 Career & Technical Education Student Achievement Award. **Announce Board of Education Candidates - Draw for Ballot Order** - Mr. Wheelock announced that Mark Evans, Steve Shrey and Christine Weber Mangini will be running for the three open seats on the Board of Education. - to approve the district's Professional Development Plan as per Part 100 of the Regulations of the New York State Commissioner of Education.
- to approve Friday, May 22, 2015 as an unused snow day providing there is no further need for snow days.
- that the Board of Education authorizes the Board President to sign two copies of the Fund Surplus Resolution Agreement and Release between the Sauquoit Valley Central School District and Questar III BOCES.
- that the minutes of the April 7, 2015 meeting be approved.
- that the Treasurer's Reports of Balances be approved as presented.
- that authorization be given regarding the payment of bills approved by the claims auditor.
- that the quarterly extra-classroom activity report be approved as presented.
- that the Board of Education upon completion of its review of the IEP in accordance with Section 200.4(d)(2) of the Regulations of the Commissioner agrees to arrange for appropriate special education programs and services for students numbered 100399, 102989, 102756, 400895, 102624, 140305, 102901 and 102674 as recommended by the Committee on Special Education.

<u>Miscellaneous Topics</u> - Mr. Bottini gave special recognition to two students from Sauquoit Valley who were selected by the Observer-Dispatch as teen all-stars: Ethan Evans and Caleb Wheelock. Mr. Bottini also expressed that the Common Core curriculum ought not to impede a teacher's ability to teach to the heart in order to get to a student's head. He has great concern that Common Core detracts from this premise and erodes local control in a school district.

<u>Miscellaneous Topics (Cont'd)</u> - Mr. Dever asked, as a Board, is it their responsibility to communicate back to state officials how Sauquoit Valley is being impacted by the changes they are making. He believes that it is and has asked district administration to compile a report on how Sauquoit Valley has been impacted by lack of funding and the various educational reforms that have and continue to occur.

<u>Public to Be Heard</u> - Mrs. Overrocker asked if anyone wished to address the Board and one person did so. **Mr. Madden** thanked Mr. Bottini for giving the address at the National Junior Honor Society Induction Ceremony on Wednesday, April 8, 2015.

Resolution No. 72 made by Mrs. Miller, seconded by Mr. Bottini, to put before the voters on May 19, 2015 the budget for the Sauquoit Valley Central School District for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016 as presented by the Board of Education in the amount of \$20,041,201 and the necessary real property taxes required shall be raised by a tax on the taxable property in said district to be levied and collected as required by law.
