Homebound, Hospital and Home Instruction

When it appears that a student will be absent from school for more than ten (10) consecutive days because of health or physical impairment, a school counselor will contact the parents or guardian to discuss educational support for their student while they are unable to attend school. Working with the parents or guardian as well as the school administration, the school counselor will schedule academic and counseling support for the student at the student's home or in the hospital. Appropriate educational services may begin as soon as eligibility has been established with a written statement from a licensed medical provider and a written parental or guardian request.

Prior to the first day of services the parents or guardian and the school district will develop a written agreement which will include the time and days of the service, where the service will be provided (be specific), how long the service will be required, what services will be provided (be specific), etc.

Precautions will be taken by all parties involved so that no one is put into an uncomfortable situation. When services are to be provided at the home of the student, tutoring should take place in a common living area with a parent or guardian present. When the student requires services at a location other than the student's home a parent or guardian of the student must be present.

Such students shall be included in calculating the average daily attendance
