

Credit by Examination

A student may receive credit toward high school graduation by passing an examination which assesses the student's knowledge of a given subject. The examinations must be approved and administered by the school district and must cover the content included in a regular secondary education course on the subject. The student passing such examinations will not be required to attend the regular school course in which the subject is taught.

Examination grades will be a Pass/Fail grade with 75% the lowest score a student may receive and pass the examination.

A student may receive credit by examination for no more than four (4) of the total credits required for graduation.
