

Student Vehicle Parking

Students are permitted to park on school premises as a matter of privilege, not of right. Patrols and inspections may be conducted without notice, without student consent, and without a search warrant. Students are required to unlock vehicles for reasonable inspection when required to do so by an administrator. Failure to cooperate may result in the loss of permission to drive a vehicle onto campus, in-school suspension or short-term suspension from school. In cases involving drugs, alcohol or firearms, the local sheriff or police may be called.

Students will be permitted to park their vehicle in the school parking lot provided they have:

- a. Current vehicle insurance policy;
- b. Driver's license; and
- c. Vehicle registration.

Additional parking requirements include:

1. Students must complete the Student Vehicle Parking form prior to parking on school grounds.
2. Automobiles are restricted to parking in spaces marked for parking. All automobiles inappropriately parked are subject to being towed without additional warning and at owner's expense.
3. The Notus School District assumes no responsibility of automobiles left in the lot overnight.
4. The Notus School District is not responsible for theft or damage to automobiles parked in the student parking lot.
5. The student parking lot is off limits during normal class time, except when the student has written permission from an administrator.
6. Students are prohibited from loitering in the parking lot. Students must enter the building immediately upon arrival.
7. Notus Schools parking permits must be visible on the mirror and may only be used on vehicles that correspond to their Student Vehicle Parking form
8. Students must adhere to all traffic laws, to parking lot speed limits (5 MPH) and to safe driving practices on school property and in school zones.
9. Students with multiple cars must apply for multiple Student Parking Permits to insure the

permit in the vehicle matches with a student registration.

Any violation of this policy shall result in the following:

- a. First Offense: Conference between administration and student (SRO and parent may be included if the offense is significant). May result in loss of parking privileges.
- b. Second Offense: Conference with administration, SRO, parent and student and may result in loss of privileges.
- c. Third/additional Offense: Conference with administration, SRO, parent and student with loss of parking privileges.
- d. The severity of violation may result in immediate loss of parking privilege for the student and a student and parent conference.
