## ESL Level 1

Students in Level 1 are just beginning to develop English skills.

*We learn:*

- Vocabulary development
- Verb usage
- Basic grammar

*We talk about:*

Food, Clothing, Colors, Time, Work, Health, Family.

## ESL Level 2

Students in Level 2 have had a little more experience with English.

*We learn:*

*We talk about:*

## ESL Level 3

Students in Level 3 have basic skills in English vocabulary and grammar.

- Citizenship, American history, American holidays
- How to apply for a job, talk in an interview and follow up.

*We talk about:*

Students in Level 4 seek to review, refine and expand their skills in English.
