School Counselors:



- **Academic Development**

- Meet with students to develop a 4-year graduation plan
- Track graduation and “A-G” requirements
- Promote rigorous coursework (AP/Honors/Dual Enrollment courses) to maximize student’s academic potential
- Support students in developing lifelong skills, such as communication, time management and positive work habits

- **Career Development**

- Help students with going “from here to anywhere!”
- Provide self-discovery utilizing Naviance tools, such as Strengths Explorer and Career Interest Profiler
- Assist students with exploring postsecondary options, (i.e. 4-year colleges/universities, community colleges, trade schools, military, workforce)

- **Social/Emotional Development**

- Provide a positive environment that enhances student ability to properly manage the social/emotional demands of their lives
- Serve as a referral source for students when social/emotional issues become too great to be dealt with solely by the school counselor, including crisis interventions
- Connect students and families to community resources

- Athletes: make sure the courses you sign up for do not conflict with your practice schedule

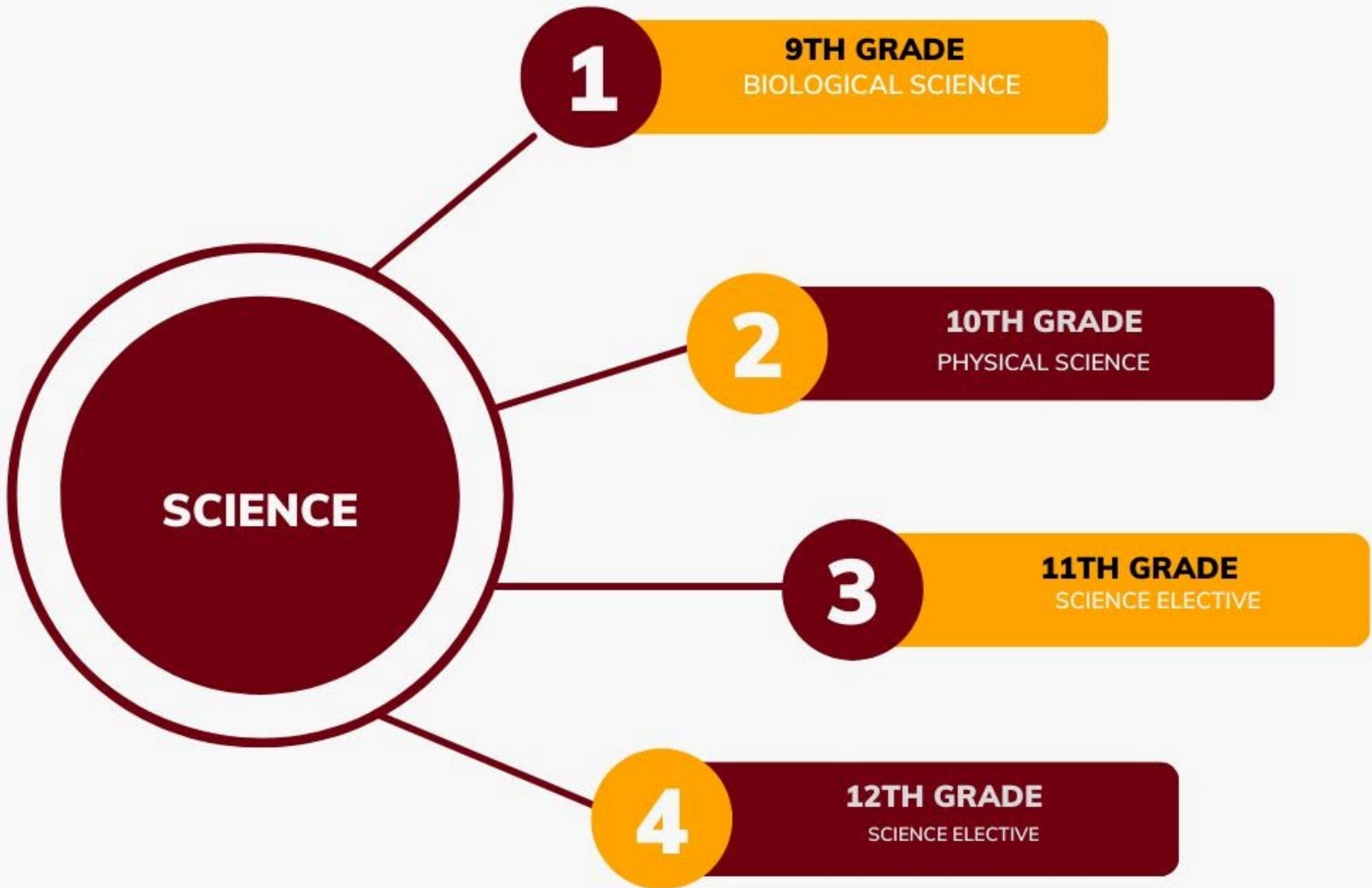


Credit Recovery Available

Sample Senior Year - must have at least 50 credits

(5 classes)!!!

1. English 12 / AP Eng Lit / ERWC
2. Government/Economics
3. Math *(4th year recommended)*
4. Science *(4th year recommended) or Elective*
5. Fine Art *(if not already completed) or Elective*
6. Elective/Foreign Lang./CEC-ROP/ D.E.- Moorpark College
(Note: Registration for DE classes is your responsibility)

Note: Seniors **MUST** have a minimum of 5 classes (25 credits) per semester. Work Experience **OR** Dual Enrollment can only count towards **ONE of your FIVE** courses as an off-campus choice.

*Reminder: College/University (“a-g”) minimum:

- 2 years language other than English *(3 preferred for some)*

AND

- 1 year visual or performing art

Sample Junior Year - must have at least 60 credits (6 classes)

1. English 11, ERW 11, or AP Eng Lang
2. US History or AP US History
3. Math
4. Science
5. Foreign Lang or Elective
6. Fine Art (*if not already completed*) or Elective/Sport/CEC-ROP / D.E.- Moorpark College

*Reminder: College/University (“a-g”) minimum:

- 2 years language other than English (3 preferred for some)

AND

- 1 year visual or performing art

***Be sure you have completed your credits in:
Practical Arts, Computer Ed., PE, and Health!***

Sample Sophomore Year - must have at least 60 credits (6 classes)

1. English 10, English 10 Honors, or AP Seminar
2. World History or AP World History
3. Math (*typically Geometry*)
4. Science (*typically Physics or Chem*)
5. Foreign Lang or Elective
6. Physical Education/Sport

Dual Enrollment option available to add to your schedule as a 7th period

*Reminder: College/University (“a-g”) minimum:

- 2 years of Language Other Than English (*or equivalent*)

(3 years preferred for the more competitive universities)

AND

- 1 year visual or performing art
