Note 18: The way one district compensates administrators can be very different than the way another district compensates their administrators. This comparison most likely is not an "apples to apples" comparison. Refer to Line 40 for a more "apples" comparison of total Administration Expenditure Per-pupil which includes salaries and other expenses.

- Note 39: Local Tax Effort is an index that reflects the extent of the effort residents make in supporting public elementary and secondary education. This index is calculated in the context of the resident's ability to pay, in terms of the portion of residents' income devoted to supporting public education. The Local Tax Effort index for Lake LSD ranks 524th out of all 606 school districts in the State of Ohio, which puts Lake LSD in the bottom 14%.
- Note 45: The expenditure per pupil presented in this report reflects the unweighted per-pupil approach. The expenditure per pupil reflected on the report card is weighted based on student needs. Based on this FY2023 data, only 50 other districts in the State of Ohio spent less per pupil than Lake LSD. In other words, 555 other districts (92%) in the State of Ohio spent more per pupil than Lake LSD. Please note this figure is for "operating" expenditures only, expenditures classified as "non-operating" are not included, so this is not a total.

Note 48: State property tax reimbursements on behalf of property taxpayers for homestead and rollback tax credits for home owners are reflected in Line 46 as State Revenue.

Note 54: Based on this FY2023 data, only 15 other districts in the State of Ohio receive less Total Revenue Per-pupil than Lake LSD. In other words, 590 other districts (97%) in the State of Ohio receive more Total Revenue Per-pupil than Lake LSD.
