ELECTRONICS PROTOCOL

In a recent School Community Council meeting, I presented information on how to keep students safe while using technology. This same information was presented to our faculty. In each meeting, parents and teachers expressed a strong desire to create a safer technology environment at Bonneville.

There were several issues brought up during these meetings for regarding phones and smart watches. It included disruptions in the instructional setting, reports of students taking pictures or videos of other students, and inappropriate use of personal devices in the bathroom or on the playground. Parents and teachers have asked for more enforcement of the <u>S-II policy</u> to address these concerns.

To support student safety and the instructional environment we will be implementing the following procedures when we return to school in January.

- I. We are asking that parents do not send phones or smart watches to school with their children. While board policy states students may have electronic devices in their possession during the regular school day, it also states devices must remain out of sight during instructional time AND be turned off OR on silent mode. As such, any student who brings an electronic device to school will be asked to leave it in their locker and turned OFF during the day. Please remember, students who bring personal devices to school do so at their own risk and the school is not responsible for personal devices.
 - 2. Violations of this procedure will result in the following actions:
 - a. First time, teachers will remind the student to place the device in their locker and to not take it back out.
 - b. Second time, teachers will keep the device for the remainder of the day and return to the student at the end of the day.
 - c. Third time, teachers will keep the device for the remainder of the day and the student's caregiver will be notified. Device will be given back to the student at the end of the day.
 - d. Fourth time, teachers will turn the device into the office where a caregiver will be required to pick it up.
- 3. Exceptions may be made for students with extenuating health circumstances.
