# Dual Language Immersion Program

Dual Language Immersion Program is a unique educational program offered in Franklin McKinley School District (FMSD) that builds student bilingualism and biliteracy in English and Spanish. The Dual Language Immersion Program integrates native English speaking and English language learning Spanish speaking students in the same classroom. The teacher provides academic instruction through two languages, one of which is the primary language of each group (Spanish and English).

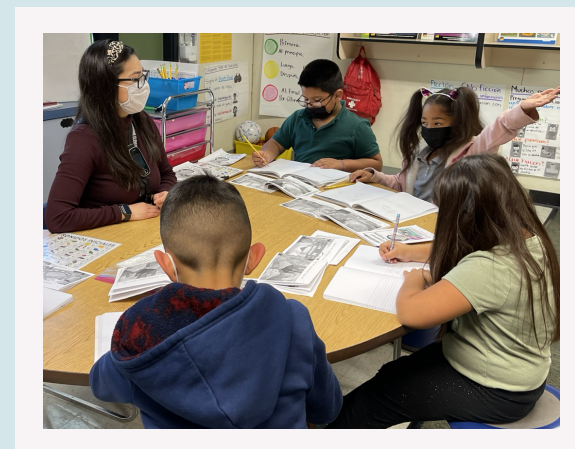
## Instructional model

In Kindergarten, instruction is delivered in Spanish 90% of the day and in English 10% of the day. The amount of English language instruction increases as the students move up in grade level. By 4th grade, 50% of the day is taught in English and 50% in Spanish. Classes consist of 50% English and 50% Spanish speaking students who serve as language models for each other.

## Benefits of Dual Language immersion

### The goals of this K-6th program include:

- **Bilingualism-** Students will develop high levels of language proficiency in Spanish and English.



- **Academic achievement-** Students will perform at or above grade level in academic subjects aligned to state standards in both languages.



- **Multiculturalism-** Students will develop a positive cultural identity and other cultures appreciation as a 21st century citizen.



### Research shows students will:

- Strengthen cognitive skills and attain high academic achievement in two languages.
- Speak fluently in two languages and acquire skills to succeed in a global economy.
- Foster cross-cultural competency.
- Competitive for college, scholarships, and career opportunities.

## Who can participate?

Any incoming student attending Kindergarten turning 5 years old on or before September 1st. The class is composed by half native Spanish speakers and half English speakers.
