### **Minute to Win It Holiday Challenge**





## **FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTION DAYS**

**The Trinity Area School District has been approved** to utilize Flexible Instruction Days (FIDs). Trinity will move to remote instruction when schools are closed due to weather or other concerns. It is no longer a necessity to cancel instruction for weather or facility related issues. When a FID is announced, teachers will teach from home and students will learn remotely from home. If it becomes necessary to cancel in-person school, staff, parents, guardians, and students will receive notification via the Skylert System, local television, and radio sources. On FIDs the students will log onto their **Chromebooks and attend school remotely as they** have done during closures for the pandemic. Staff, parents/guardians, and students need to be prepared for short-term or sporadic closures due to weather related issues. Students should have their Chromebooks available daily at school and at home. Staff and students must be prepared to work from home at all times.
