BYLAWS OF THE BOARD

School Board Powers and Duties

- I. The Board shall establish rules and regulations for the governing of the School District.
- II. It shall select and evaluate a Chief Executive Officer (the Superintendent of Schools) and delegate to him or her the authority of administering the policies of the Board of Trustees.
- III. The Board shall require its Chief Executive Officer to prepare data and to make recommendations which will enable the Board of Trustees to establish sound policies.
- IV. The Board (on the basis of policies established) shall determine the general nature of the educational program, including such matters as the number and types of schools and departments to be maintained and the variety and character of services to be provided.
- V. The Board shall employ all school personnel for the District on the recommendation of the Superintendent, in keeping with the personnel policies of the Board.
- VI. The Board shall adopt suitable written policies and regulations for all District employees with reference to qualifications for employment in various types of positions, salaries, leaves of absences, tenure, separation from employment and other personnel matters.
- VII. The Board shall determine all financial policies not specifically defined by State law, and shall exercise general supervision over the finances of the District in keeping with good budgetary procedures, which shall be developed by the Superintendent and approved by the Board.
- VIII. The Board, with the advice of the superintendent of Schools, shall approve of all facility closures, leases, and sale of property.
- IX. The Board with the advice of the Superintendent, shall adopt textbooks, and approve courses of study.
- X. The Board shall conduct its affairs in such a manner as to keep the public informed of its policies and operations of the Cambrian School District.

XI. It is legislative in that it is a policy making Board. It is judicial in that it may approve or reject recommendations.
