Research with Warwick University




On Friday 20th October we welcomed Sophie and Tabitha from Warwick University Medical school into Southam College, to explore a possible future intervention for students with eating and body image concerns. There are currently barriers to treatments for eating disorders, so universities are exploring prevention education before this becomes too advanced for young people.

Students from years 7, 9, 12 and 13 volunteered their time to take part in a student focus group. They discussed the advantages and disadvantages of an intervention being delivered in school compared to a clinical setting. We then welcomed a group of parents to discuss the intervention, sensitivities around data and how recruitment could take place.

Thank you to each of the parents who took the time to join us and contribute. We also held a school staff focus group of Teachers, SLT, Teaching Assistants and Heads of Year to discuss the practicalities of implementing the intervention in school. Thank you to all staff who gave up their lunchtime, and especially to Ms Smith who supported with organising the research.

A special thank you to Warwick University for reaching out to us. We are passionate about enhancing our current Mental Health and Wellbeing provision for our students, and hope this research will lead us to being able to participate in an effectiveness study from 2024.

ICE AND FROZEN WATER

WATER SAFETY

DO NOT TAKE THE RISK

We would like to remind people of the extreme danger of playing near or attempting to walk on frozen ponds, lakes, canals or rivers.

Please do not take unnecessary risks by venturing on frozen water, stay off the ice and keep pets on a lead.

If you fall through the ice

- Keep calm and call for help.
- If no help is available spread your arms across the surface of the ice.
- · If the ice is strong enough kick your legs and slide onto the ice.
- · Lie flat and pull yourself to the bank.
- . If the ice is very thin, break it in front of you and make your way to the shore
- If you cannot climb out, wait for help keeping as still as possible.
- Press your arms by your side and keep your legs together.
 - Once-you are safe, go to hospital immediately for a check-up.



LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME UPDATED INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

The Supreme Court clarified has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time (Platt v Isle of Wright 2017). The Supreme Court has made clear that attending school 'regularly' means that the children must attend school on every day that they are required to do so. As such, the parents of any child who is absent from school without authorisation for any length of time are likely to be considered as committing an offence under s444 of the Education Act 1996.

The regulations regarding Leave of Absence (The Education (Pupil Regulations) (England) Regulations 2006 as amended by Education (Pupil Regulations) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013.) advise:

 Head teachers shall not grant any Leave of Absence during term time unless they consider there are exceptional circumstances relating to the application.

If the leave is granted, Head teachers are able to determine the number of school days a child can be absent for.

It is for the Head teacher to decide what is 'exceptional' and it is at their discretion if the circumstances warrant the leave to be granted. When making an application for Leave of Absence in advance parents are advised to give sufficient information and time to allow the Head teacher the opportunity to consider all the exceptional circumstances and to notify parents of their decision. It is advised that if the resident parent has not received notification or a response regarding the leave of absence application, it is their responsibility to ascertain if the leave is authorised prior to the start of the leave.

The school can only consider Leave of Absence requests which are made by the 'resident' parent ie the parent with whom the child normally resides.

Where applications for leave of absence are made in advance and refused, the child will be required to be in school on the dates set out in the application. If the child is absent during that period, it will be recorded as an unauthorised absence, which may result in legal action being taken against the parent(s), by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice.

Where a leave of absence is requested, but additional days taken either prior to or after the request may be considered as part of the leave of absence and could result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the parent(s).

Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case-by-case basis and on its own merits.

Leave of Absences which are not made in advance cannot be authorised in line with legislation. This will result in the absence being recorded as 'unauthorised'. This may result in legal action against the parent, by way of a Fixed Penalty Notice. All matters of unauthorised absence relating to a Leave of Absence will be referred to the Warwickshire Attendance Service, part of Warwickshire County Council.

It is important to note, Fixed Penalty Notices are issued to each parent of each absent child, (for example 2 children and 2 parents, means each parent will receive 2 invoices in the amount of £120 each, totalling £240 for both children, this is reduced to £60 per child if paid within 21 days).

Where a Fixed Penalty Notice is not paid within the required timeframe as set out on the notice, the matter will be referred to Warwickshire County Council's Legal Services to consider instigating criminal proceedings under S444 Education Act 1996.

Fixed Penalty Notices are issued in accordance with Warwickshire County Council's Code of Conduct for Penalty Notices.
