Throughout its prestigious history, CBC has served the academic and cocurricular needs of tens of thousands of students. In 2003, and in response to its growing enrollment demand and need for additional facilities, the community built its expansive state-of-the-art facilities on its 45-acre De La Salle Drive campus in the suburbs of St. Louis. Today, 850 young men grow intellectually, spiritually, creatively, and physically within a spirited and supportive school community.

CBC has been continually accredited since 1927, and our school has regularly received high scores from the educational leaders sent to evaluate us. In 2022, CBC received a composite score of 386 points out of a possible 400 earning Cognia's School of Distinction, an honor only given to 96 schools in the Cognia global network . This is one of the highest scores ever delivered by the Cognia review team.

The Brothers of the Christian Schools

Christian Brothers College High School is administered by the Midwest District of the De La Salle Christian Brothers, part of the international Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools. The De La Salle Christian Brothers have been serving youth through the ministry of education since 1680.

The Midwest District is one of three districts within the US/Toronto Region, with its provincial headquarters in Burr Ridge, IL. The Midwest District sponsors three universities, seventeen high schools including CBC High School, several middle schools, retreat centers and a variety of other educational ministries in the Midwest District.

A Brother is a man who has answered God's call and has given himself completely to Our Lord by the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. He has decided to make that commitment in order to put all his powers at the educational service of children and young people. That is why he is called a "religious educator."

To understand the vocation of the Christian Brother one must initially gain knowledge of the way of life of a Brother and the spirit, charism, and mission of the Institute. This experience fosters love for God, the Brothers, and others. This in turn may lead to the desire for commitment, action, and service as a Brother expressed through ministry.

Lasallian Education

Christian Brothers College High School is a Catholic school committed to providing a college preparatory education to students from all backgrounds. As a Lasallian school, CBC's faculty and staff are dedicated to helping every student realize the maximum potential of his God-given talents and abilities.

The Christian Brothers were founded by St. John Baptist de La Salle, the patron saint of teachers. De La Salle was born in Reims, France, in 1651 and is the founder of the Brothers of the Christian Schools (commonly known as the De La Salle Christian Brothers.) As an educator, De La Salle is widely considered by scholars to have been an innovator in the development of teacher training programs as well as school curriculum and religious practices.

De La Salle recognized that teachers stand in a providential and grace-filled relationship with their students. He regarded the school as a faith community and sought teachers who were ministers of grace who exercise their vocation daily by instructing young people in the principles of the Gospel and academics.

Following this mission and vision, CBC strives to be a community of students, families, faculty and staff that is continually aware of the presence and providence of God in every person's life. The community provides an environment where students develop their unique talents and leadership potential in order to best prepare for college and for life.



CAMPUS LIFE AT CBC

One of the things that CBC prides itself on is the "Total Experience" for its students, believing that the high school goes far beyond the classroom. Therefore, CBC offers a wide range of experiences for students outside of the typical "school day". Over 90% of students participate in either Athletics or co-curricular activities at CBC. This is a number that makes CBC very proud. Students choose to do more than "just go to school at CBC".

Communities

The essence of school spirit and genuine brotherhood distinguishes the CBC experience. A pivotal factor contributing to this atmosphere is the CBC Community system, providing students with the chance to foster connections across various grade levels within a lively, inclusive, and competitive environment.

Each of CBC's 10 Communities carries the name of a Cadet legend. This offers students an understanding of the strong tradition that comes with being a part of the CBC family. Students in each Community work together and learn from each other as they compete against other Communities in events based on six categories: Activities, Mission, Spirit, Social, Academics and Discipline. Points are collected throughout the year with the winning Community receiving the Cadet Cup while getting to miss an afternoon of school to attend a Cardinal game.

ABOUT THE POSITION

The school operates in the President and Principal model in which the President serves as the chief executive officer of the school. As such, the President is responsible for the operational vitality for the school, including advancement, enrollment, marketing, finances, and capital projects. The President leads and articulates the school's mission and vision, creates, and implements strategic plans, and builds and nurtures constituent and stakeholder relationships on and off campus. The President also bears ultimate responsibility for the school's Catholic identity and is supported by a robust senior leadership team in carrying out these responsibilities.

The key responsibilities of the President of CBC include the following:

- Maintain Catholic identity and steward the mission and vision of the school
- Establish and maintain relationships with pastors, presidents, and principals of Catholic, private and public schools (High, Middle and Elementary) throughout the greater St. Louis region
- Establish and maintain meaningful relationships with alumni and other stakeholders of the school
- Direct, manage and support the efforts of direct reports and various administrative departments to ensure the success of their missions
- Meet regularly with administration to identify needs and initiatives, foster communication, and address needs and requirements to ensure effective operation of the school
- Report to, seek the advice of, and act upon the agreed direction of the Board of Directors to ensure the continued successful operation of the school, now and in the future



- Serve as chief spokesperson for the school and communicates with various public and private stakeholders with properly prepared published materials, website content, social media and verbal and other written communication
- Implement and monitor a strategic plan for campus facilities as required for growth and modernization to meet the needs of the academic and extracurricular programs

OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

CBC is a distinguished college preparatory school with nearly 175 years of legendary history serving the Catholic education needs of young men and families of the St. Louis region. While competing in this uber-competitive private school education market, CBC has established itself as the standard of consistency, evidenced by its strong enrollment for over 60 years. For these and many other reasons, CBC is one of the nation's preeminent Catholic preparatory schools.

The next President will be expected to capitalize on the school's excellent resources and the area demographics to actualize the institution's full potential while remaining true to its Catholic and Christian Brothers values. To achieve this objective, the board and leadership team engaged an architectural firm to undertake a master plan of its facilities and real estate properties, aiming for optimal space and resource allocation.

Some of the challenges for the new President will likely include the following:

- Maintain the outstanding academic reputation of the school while continuing to foster equally impressive outcomes for athletics, the arts, and other co-curricular activities.
- Build immediate rapport and trust with internal and external constituents and stakeholders.





- Understand and appreciate the highly competitive local Catholic and private secondary education market while securing the necessary annual philanthropic support to keep tuition affordable.
- Work closely with the board to develop a bold, credible, near-term vision and plan for the school and execute the plan with rigor and discipline.
- Cultivate and demonstrate the distinct advantages of the President/ Principal Model for the benefit of the school.
- Grow the donor base to enrich the overall financial condition of the school and begin building a culture of philanthropy that will expand access for students and sustain the important mission of the school as a welcoming and inclusive Catholic institution.
- Prepare the school for a significant capital campaign as it nears its 175th anniversary in 2025.
- Continue raising the profile and value proposition of the school's Catholic identity and model CBC'S core values in one's leadership of the school.

THE CANDIDATE

As mentioned earlier in this document, the school operates in the President/ Principal Model. In this increasingly popular and powerful leadership structure, the Principal/ COO reports to the President/CEO and is responsible for overseeing day-to-day academic and co-curricular operations, which frees up the President to be the more outward facing "institution builder" – the fundraiser, friend raiser, vision-setter, and overall public face of the school to the community. This key role will require a leader with exceptional poise, presence, energy, and communications skills. It will also

require an effective team builder who will work in partnership with the Principal and senior leadership team in driving the agenda and achieving the board's great ambitions for the school.

To qualify for this extraordinary opportunity, you will need to be a practicing Catholic, accomplished mission-driven servant-leader with a portfolio of leadership successes, and experienced in working with a high-level fiduciary Board.

The board welcomes candidates from other Catholic or independent schools as well as accomplished executives from other mission-critical career venues such as higher education; non-profit foundations, associations, charities, and the like; or the corporate, civic, and professional services arenas. While knowledge of education and school operations is preferred, other qualities and experiences are also greatly valued, especially visionary, entrepreneurial leadership and the ability to inspire, lead a high performing team, and create demand for the extraordinary gifts of a Catholic all-boys education.

This is a rare and timely opportunity to take a high performing independently sponsored school to the next level while championing the critical role of Catholic schools for children, families, and communities.
