

WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOOL
EXIT INTERVIEW

Under Indiana law, any student who is at least sixteen (16) years of age but is not yet eighteen (18) years of age, may withdraw from school prior to graduation after an exit interview has been conducted with the student's parent or guardian and the student's building principal. Consent of the withdrawal by all three parties is required.

A student may not withdraw from school unless the withdrawal is due to 1) financial hardship and the student must be employed in order to support the family; 2) the student's illness; or 3) an order of a court with jurisdiction over the student

The Board of School Trustees of the Lafayette School Corporation designates the following school personnel to conduct the exit interview of a student enrolled at the specified school who wishes to withdraw from school:

Principal of Lafayette Jefferson High School or his/her designee
Principal of Lafayette Tecumseh Junior High School or his/her designee
Principal of Oakland Academy or his/her designee
