The Superintendent shall not fail to develop and adopt rigorous, standards-based academic programs that enable all students to achieve the outcomes stated in the Board's *Ends* policies.

Accordingly, the Superintendent will not:

- 1. Operate without developing and implementing academic programs that:
  - Meet and/or exceed state and nationally recognized standards.
  - Are research-based.
  - Provide access and challenge for all students.
  - Are comprehensive and culturally responsive.
  - Provide innovative solutions that close the identified academic achievement opportunity gaps.
  - Maintain a cohesive, holistic curriculum across all grade levels, K to 12.
  - Adequately measure each student's progress toward achieving the standards (i.e. a standards-based grading and reporting system).
- 2. Lead without providing fair and transparent academic processes that support student learning.
- 3. Lead without ensuring faculty understand, know, and teach the adopted curriculum through a program of rigorous professional staff development, training, coaching, and support.
- Fail to reasonably ensure that the instructional program includes opportunities for students to develop talents and interests in a variety of specialized areas including extracurricular involvement.
- 5. Lead without ensuring the regular monitoring and evaluation of the academic program and making appropriate modifications in practice and content.
- 6. Avoid regularly updating curricula and recommending approval of updates to the Board Consent (Required Approvals) Agenda.
