The Board of directors recognizes that under some circumstances, animals may have an educational value in the school setting. At the same time, adequate provisions must be made for the health, safety, and well-being of students, staff, and the animals. Health issues (allergies, vaccinated status of the animal) involving students and staff shall be addressed before permission is given to allow the animal in school. Animals in schools, or on school district property, shall be planned and approved in accordance with procedures established by the Superintendent or designee and approval must be received from the Principal or Superintendent designee before any animals are brought onto school grounds. Animals that are a part of the educational program shall be under the control of their adult-owner, the teacher or designated students at all times. Animals will not be transported in a school vehicle.

This policy does not apply to service animals for the disabled.
